ORDINANCE NO. 10-037

RELATING TO THE GROWTH MANAGEMENT ACT, AMENDING APPENDIX B OF THE COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES FOR SNOHOMISH COUNTY TO REFLECT REVISED MUNICIPAL URBAN GROWTH AREA (MUGA) BOUNDARIES BETWEEN THE CITIES OF BOTHELL AND MILL CREEK

WHEREAS, the Growth Management Act (GMA) at RCW 36.70A.210(2) requires adoption of countywide planning policies which consist of written policy statements used for establishing a countywide framework from which the county and city comprehensive plans are developed and adopted under the GMA; and

WHEREAS, RCW 36.70A.210 also requires that the countywide planning policies govern interjurisdictional collaboration of county and city planning efforts and implementation of GMA requirements for designating urban growth areas; and

WHEREAS, Countywide Planning Policy (CPP) UG-17 establishes that MUGAs shall be established within the Southwest Urban Growth Area (SWUGA) and documented in county and city comprehensive plans for the purposes of allocating population as required by GMA and delineating future annexation areas for each of the nine cities in the SWUGA; and

WHEREAS, CPP UG-17 also establishes that MUGA boundaries that are not congruent with the Southwest UGA boundary may be amended by agreement and action by the affected cities following consultation by the County; and

WHEREAS, the Cities of Bothell and Mill Creek have agreed on a shared MUGA boundary through Bothell Resolution No. 1229 (2009) and Mill Creek Ordinance No. 2009-705, following consultation by the County; and

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2010, the Snohomish County Tomorrow (SCT) Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) recommended to the SCT Steering Committee amendments to the MUGA map and associated MUGA population growth targets (Table 3) as depicted in Appendix B of the CPPs to reflect the agreement between Bothell and Mill Creek; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2010, the SCT Executive Committee reviewed the PAC recommendation and recommended that it be approved by the SCT Steering Committee; and

WHEREAS, on February 24, 2010, the SCT Steering Committee reviewed the PAC recommendation and recommended that it be forwarded to the County Council for approval; and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Council held a public hearing on July 7, 2010, to consider the entire record, including the SCT Steering Committee recommendations on the proposed amendments to the MUGA map and associated MUGA population growth targets (Table 3) as depicted in Appendix B of the CPPs to reflect the agreement between Bothell and Mill Creek, and to hear public testimony on this Ordinance No. 10-037.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. The county council makes the following findings of fact:

- A. The county council adopts and incorporates the foregoing recitals as findings as if set forth fully herein.
- B. The amendment would amend the MUGA boundary between the cities of Bothell and Mill
 Creek as depicted in Exhibit A of this ordinance. The proposed amendment would shift
 approximately 97 acres of the unincorporated Mill Creek MUGA into the unincorporated
 Bothell MUGA.
- 20 C. The amendment would amend the MUGA Population Growth Targets for the cities of 21 Bothell and Mill Creek as depicted in Exhibit B of this ordinance. In conjunction with the proposed MUGA map amendment depicted in Exhibit A, the proposed amendment depicted 22 23 in Exhibit B would shift a portion of Mill Creek's unincorporated MUGA population target 24 into the unincorporated Bothell MUGA (specifically, 715 persons as of the 2002 base year, 285 persons as part of the 2002-2025 projected population growth, and 1,000 persons as part 25 of the total 2025 population target). The proposed MUGA population growth target 26 27 amendments do not alter the total unincorporated SWUGA population target for 2025.
- D. The map amendment is consistent with CPP UG-17 regarding the establishment of and amendments to MUGA boundaries.
- E. The map and growth target amendments are consistent with CPP OD-1 regarding development within urban growth areas, adding certainty to capital facility planning and the coordinated extension of urban services.
- F. The proposed amendments require consideration of corresponding amendments to the Snohomish County General Policy Plan (GPP) Map 3 MUGA Map and Appendix D Growth Targets, as currently proposed in GPP 10 (MUGA Revisions) as part of the county's 2010 annual comprehensive plan amendment process.
- G. The map and growth target amendments are consistent with and implement the following GPP Goals, Objectives and Policies:

- 1 1. Goal PE 1, "Establish a subcounty allocation of projected growth to the year 2025 that is consistent with the goals of the Growth Management Act and the countywide planning policies."
- 2. Policy PE 1.A.4 "The population and employment allocation for the unincorporated Southwest UGA shown in Appendix D shall include subtotals for the municipal urban growth areas (MUGAs) associated in the countywide planning policies with each of the nine cities in the Southwest UGA."
- 8 3. Policy IC 1.A.1 "The county shall continue participation in Snohomish County Tomorrow to reconcile, monitor and, if necessary, adjust population and employment growth targets; to resolve possible inconsistency between the local jurisdictions' plans; and to provide for common siting of essential public facilities."
- Objective IC 1.B "Work with cities and towns to provide for the orderly transition of unincorporated to incorporated areas within UGAs."
- 5. Policy IC 1.B.1 "The county shall work with cities in planning for orderly transfer of service responsibilities in anticipation of potential or planned annexations or incorporations within UGAs."
- 6. Objective IC 1.E "Re-evaluate and, as required, modify MUGA boundaries to facilitate county planning for the development of these urban areas."
 - 7. Policy IC 1.E.3 "MUGA boundaries shall be reevaluated on a periodic basis and adjustments made as needed through the county's Comprehensive Plan amendment process."
- 22 8. Policy IC 1.E.5 "MUGA boundaries that are not congruent with the SWUGA boundary 23 may be amended by agreement and action by the affected cities and the county, 24 consistent with 1.E.3."
- H. The proposed amendments comply with the requirements of GMA, including RCW
 36.70A.110(2) which states that the county shall consult with each city on the boundaries of
 their urban growth areas.
- 28 I. No inconsistencies between the proposed amendments and GPP plan elements or development regulations have been identified.
- J. No inconsistencies between the proposed amendments and Countywide Planning Policies
 have been identified.
- 32 K. The proposed amendments comply with all requirements of the GMA.
- L. The environmental impacts of the proposal are within the range of impacts analyzed by the DEIS and FEIS during the Ten-Year Update to the GMACP in 2005. No new impacts have been identified for the proposal, and SEPA requirements have been met through Addendum
- No. 24 issued prior to the public hearing before the Snohomish County Council. The county has already considered in these EIS documents the impacts of the GPP 10 (MUGA)

Revisions) proposal described in Addendum No. 24 as part of the county's 2010 annual comprehensive plan amendment process, such impacts being identical to those prepared for these proposed CPP amendments. No new impacts beyond those identified in the original EIS are expected to occur due to the proposal.

Section 2. The county council makes the following conclusions:

- A. The amendments would amend the MUGA boundaries between the cities of Bothell and Mill Creek as depicted in Exhibit A of this ordinance.
- B. The amendments would amend the MUGA Population Growth Targets for the cities of Bothell and Mill Creek as depicted in Exhibit B of this ordinance.
- 12 C. The amendments are consistent with the Countywide Planning Policies for Snohomish County.
- D. The amendments meet the goals, objectives, and policies of the CPPs and GPP as discussed in the specific findings.
- 16 E. The amendments to the CPPs satisfy the procedural and substantive requirements of the GMA.
- F. SEPA requirements with respect to this non-project action have been satisfied through the publication of Addendum No. 24 to the DEIS and FEIS for the Ten-Year Update to the GMACP in 2005.
- G. The county complied with state and local public participation requirements under the GMA and chapter 30.73 SCC.
- Section 3. The county council bases its findings and conclusions on the entire record, including all testimony and exhibits. Any finding, which should be deemed a conclusion, and any conclusion which should be deemed a finding, is hereby adopted as such.

Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, the Countywide Planning Policies for Snohomish County, last amended by Amended Ordinance No. 09-062 on September 8, 2009, by veto override, are amended as indicated in Exhibits A and B to this ordinance, which are attached hereto and incorporated by reference into this ordinance as if set forth in full.


