ORDINANCE NO. 11-022

RELATING TO THE REGULATION OF CONSTRUCTION; ADOPTING THE 2009 EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL MECHANICAL CODE AS REVISED; ADOPTING THE 2009 EDITION OF THE INTERNATIONAL FUEL GAS CODE AS REVISED; ADOPTING THE 2009 EDITION OF THE UNIFORM PLUMBING CODE AS REVISED; ADOPTING THE 2009 EDITION OF THE WASHINGTON STATE ENERGY CODE AS REVISED; ADOPTING THE 2008 EDITION OF THE LIQUEFIED PETROLEUM GAS CODE AS REVISED; AMENDING, ADDING AND REPEALING SECTIONS IN CHAPTERS 30.51A, 30.52B, 30.52D AND 30.52E SCC; AND REPEALING CHAPTER 30.52C SCC

WHEREAS, the merger of the International Conference of Building Officials (ICBO) with other code writing organizations led to the formation of the International Code Council, which led to the creation of a group of international codes that replaced the Uniform Building Codes in the State of Washington in 2003; and

WHEREAS, the international and state building codes are amended and comprehensively updated on a three year cycle; and

WHEREAS, the Washington State Legislature adopted the most current construction codes as the State Building Code pursuant to chapter 19.27 RCW; and

WHEREAS, the State Building Code became effective July 1, 2010; and

WHEREAS, the State Building Code Act adopts the International Building, Residential and Mechanical Codes, the Uniform Plumbing Code, the International Fuel Gas Code, the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code, and the Washington State Energy Code. These codes contain new construction and performance standards, methods, technologies, and products; and

WHEREAS, chapter 19.27 RCW mandates that the State Building Code be administered and enforced by counties and cities, and grants counties and cities limited authority to amend the code as it applies within their jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Council and the Snohomish County Executive have identified the regulation of development to ensure safe and quality construction as a high priority and have delegated the responsibility for administering the State Building Code to Snohomish County Planning and Development Services (PDS); and

WHEREAS, PDS endeavors to administer and enforce the State Building Code in accordance with chapter 19.27 RCW in order to provide for statewide consistency for the construction industry and the citizens of Snohomish County; and

WHEREAS, the 2009 edition of the International Building Code, International Residential Code and International Fire Code are adopted as amended by the State Building Code Council and Snohomish County in separate ordinances for compliance with the State Building Code Act; and

WHEREAS, on August 3, 2011, the Snohomish County Council held a public hearing after proper notice, heard public testimony related to the proposed code amendments, and considered the entire record; and

WHEREAS, immediately following the public hearings, the county council deliberated on the proposed code amendments.

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

- Section 1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein as findings and conclusions as if set forth in full.
- Section 2. The Snohomish County Council makes the following additional findings of fact:
  - A. RCW 19.27.040 allows the governing body of each county and city to amend the State Building Code as it applies within the jurisdiction of the county or city. The minimum performance standards of the codes and the objectives enumerated in RCW 19.27.020 shall not be diminished by any county amendments.
  - B. The 2009 editions of the construction codes referenced in the recitals are adopted to comply with the State Building Code. Additional local amendments are made for consistency with the administrative provisions of other subtitle 30.5 SCC construction codes. These amendments are related to administrative processes, PDS's organizational structure, appeals, fees, fee refunds and code enforcement. Appropriate cross references to other Unified Development Code chapters and code sections are also included.
  - C. Amendments to SCC 30.51A.030 are necessary to change an updated cross-reference in the 2009 International Building Code.
  - D. Amendments to SCC 30.51A.040 are necessary to correct a typo in the cross-reference to SCC 30.51A.030.
  - E. Amendments to SCC 30.52B.010 are necessary to amend the section title and code section to replace 2006 with 2009 for the International Mechanical Code and International Fuel Gas Code and amend the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Code from 2004 to 2008.
  - F. Chapter 30.52C SCC is repealed as the chapter has been incorporated into the International Mechanical Code.

- G. Amendments to SCC 30.52D.010 are necessary to amend the section title and section to replace 2006 with 2009.
- H. Amendment to SCC 30.52E.010 are necessary to amend the section title and section to replace 2006 with 2009.
- I. Amendments to SCC 30.52E.020 are necessary to amend the section to replace 2006 with 2009.
- J. A new section is added, SCC 30.52E.203, pertaining to certification. This section is new in the 2009 UPC.
- K. The international construction codes were designed to allow flexibility, innovation and use of new technologies through the allowance of alternatives.
- Section 3. The Snohomish County Council makes the following conclusions:
- A. The county council concludes that this ordinance is required to implement the State Building Code Act and not the Growth Management Act and therefore, this ordinance does not adopt development regulations under SCC 30.10.080. Pursuant to SCC 30.73.040(2)(c), planning commission review is not required.
- B. The county council concludes that adopting these amendments will not result in a less restrictive performance standards or objectives than those in the State Building Code.
- C. The county council concludes that the 2009 editions of the codes adopted by this ordinance provide needed flexibility to developers while safeguarding the public health, safety and welfare.
- D. The county council concludes that the proposed ordinance is in the best interest of Snohomish County. It will protect the life, safety and welfare of Snohomish County residents.
- E. The construction codes are categorically exempt from the State Environmental Policy Act under WAC 197-11-800(20).
- Section 4. Snohomish County Code Section 30.51A.030, last amended by Amended Ordinance No. 07-084 on September 5, 2007, is amended to read:

### 30.51A.030 Fault setback requirements.

A building or structure assigned to seismic design category D, E or F as defined in ((section)) Section 1613 of the IBC or ASCE 7-05 shall not be sited over an identified active fault.

(1) Where a development application or action requiring a project permit for any building or structure is located within a seismic hazard area, the applicant shall provide a geotechnical report consistent with the requirements of section ((1802)) 1803 of the IBC and SCC 30.62B.140. In addition to any other requirements, the geotechnical report shall include

adequate horizontal control necessary to identify the closest edge of an identified active fault trace.

(2) Buildings and structures subject to this chapter shall be required to set back fifty (50) feet from the closest edge of an identified active fault as defined in SCC 30.91A.075.

(3) The building official may modify the fault setback requirements of this chapter only when done in accordance with Section 104.10 of the IBC.

The building official may require an applicant to perform additional studies, tests, or site investigation to determine or confirm the specific location of an active fault trace and allow for optimal understanding of on-site and nearby seismic hazards, where needed to implement the requirements of SCC ((30.51.030)) 30.51A.030 or section 11.8.3 of ASCE 7-05.

State rules and regulations concerning certification shall apply.

Section 12. <u>Severability and Savings.</u> If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance. Provided, however, that if any section, sentence, clause, or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the section, sentence, clause, or phrase in effect prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect for that individual section, sentence, clause, or phrase as if this ordinance had never been adopted.
