23	WHEREAS, the Sheriff, after consultation with the Department of Public Works,
24	has recommended that certain county traffic code provisions be repealed or revised and
25	that a new provision be added relating to inattentive driving as provided herein;

29 30	Section 1. Snohomish County Code Section 11.12.020, adopted by resolution on June 15, 1970, is amended to read:

32	11.12.020 Title.
33	This chapter shall be known as the "Snohomish County Traffic Code"
34	((and it shall be sufficient to refer to this chapter or any portion thereof as the
35	"Snohomish County Traffic Code" in any prosecution for the violation of any
36	provision thereof)).

38	Section 2. A new section is added to Chapter 11.12 of the Snohomish County
39	Code to read:
10	44.42.025 Inattanting duiving
11 12	11.12.025 Inattentive driving. (1) It is a traffic infraction for a person to drive a vehicle in an inattentive
12 13	(1) It is a traffic infraction for a person to drive a vehicle in an inattentive manner over and along a county street or roadway. For purposes of this section,

 "inattentive manner" means to drive a vehicle in such a manner so as to fail to maintain a careful lookout in the direction of traffic or to otherwise drive without due vigilance for persons or property in or near the path of such vehicle.

(2) A person found to have violated this section shall be assessed a monetary penalty in the amount of \$250, plus any additional assessment imposed by state law.

Section 3. Snohomish County Code Section 11.12.050, adopted by resolution on June 15, 1970, is amended to read:

11.12.050 Violation.

Any person violating any of the provisions or failing to comply with any of the mandatory requirements of this traffic code ((for which no penalty has been otherwise prescribed)) shall be guilty of a ((misdemeanor)) traffic infraction punishable in accordance with chapter 46.63 RCW.

Section 4. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.030, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.030 Designated maximum speed limit - Residential districts.

The maximum speed limit that a person may drive a vehicle of any type on a road in a residential district in the unincorporated area of Snohomish County shall be ((twenty-five (25))) 25 miles per hour except where a different speed limit has been posted. "Residential District" shall have the ((same definition as contained)) meaning given for "residence district" in RCW 46.04.470 ((as it currently exists or as that definition is later amended)): "'Residence District' means the territory contiguous to and including a public highway not comprising a business district, when the property on such public highway for a continuous distance of 300 feet or more on either side thereof is in the main improved with residences or residences and buildings in use for business." If the definition of "residence district" in RCW 46.04.470 is later amended the amended language will control over the language of this section.

Section 5. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.050, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.050 Violation ((- Misdemeanor)).

Any violation of this chapter shall be a ((misdemeanor and is)) <u>traffic</u> <u>infraction</u> punishable in accordance with ((SCC 1.01.100 as it presently exists or as it is later amended)) <u>chapter 46.63 RCW</u>.

 Section 6. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.060, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.060 Change of existing speed limits - When effective.

Speed limits in effect on the date of the adoption of this chapter shall remain in effect until the ((director of public works)) county engineer shall change speed limits under the provisions of this ((Chapter)) chapter or when the ((Snehomish)) county council shall, by ordinance, institute speed limit changes and when such changes, in either case, are posted. Prior to the ((director of public works)) county engineer making a change in a speed limit under the provisions of this chapter, the ((director)) department of public works shall publish, in a newspaper of general circulation in the county, a notice of the proposed speed limit and the procedure for appealing the proposed speed limit. Any new speed limit will become effective upon posting consistent with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways adopted in ((Section)) SCC 11.24.010 ((of the Snehomish County Code)). No speed limit change is effective until posted.

Section 7. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.070, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.070 Authority - ((Director of Public Works)) County engineer.

The ((director of the department of public works)) county engineer is authorized to revise existing speed limits on all county roads, provided that such speed limit revisions shall not exceed 10 miles per hour. The determination of the proper speed limit will be based upon the following engineering and traffic investigation factors:

 (1) Road surface characteristics, shoulder conditions, grade, alignment and sight distance;

 (2) The 85 percentile speed and pace speed;(3) Roadside development and roadside friction;

 (4) Safe speed for curves or hazardous locations within the zone;(5) Parking practices and pedestrian activity; and

(6) Reported accident experience for a recent 12-month period.

Section 8. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.080, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.080 Appeal procedures.

The decision of the ((director of the department of public works)) county engineer concerning any speed limit ((revisions)) revision other than a temporary speed limit established pursuant to SCC 11.16.090 may be appealed by an aggrieved party to the ((Snohomish)) county council, provided that an appeal is

filed in writing within 30 calendar days from the date of the posting of the new speed zone. Any appeal must be submitted to the clerk of the ((Snohomish)) county council, ((6th) 8th floor, ((Snohomish County Administration)) Robert J. Drewel Building, 3000 Rockefeller, M/S/ 609, Everett, Washington, 98201.

Section 9. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.090, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.090 Special conditions.

Reduced temporary speed limits for special conditions, such as where there is construction on or near a county road, may be set by the ((director of public works)) county engineer, provided these locations are posted with signs in accordance with the ((federal highway administration's)) manual on uniform traffic control devices adopted in SCC 11.24.010. Such temporary speed limits may ((change)) reduce the posted speed limit by more than 10 miles per hour.

Section 10. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.100, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.100 Log of speed limits.

The ((director of public works)) county engineer shall maintain a log for each established speed limit. The log shall list each road section and the speed limit thereon, and the beginning and ending mile posts for each such road segment.

Section 11. Snohomish County Code Section 11.16.110, adopted by Ordinance No. 84-089 on August 27, 1984, is amended to read:

11.16.110 Reduced speed where persons working.

A maximum speed limit of 20 miles per hour is hereby established for those areas of Snohomish county in which authorized persons are working within the traveled roadway, provided said areas are posted with signs in accordance with the ((federal highway administration's)) manual on uniform traffic control devices adopted in SCC 11.24.010.

Section 12. Snohomish County Code Section 11.24.010, adopted by resolution on February 5, 1973, is amended to read:

11.24.010 Adoption of state provisions.

The "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways" as <u>adopted or</u> amended by the state ((highway commission)) <u>department of transportation under chapter 47.36 RCW</u>, be and is hereby adopted by Snohomish county, to apply to all county roads and streets.
