1 Approved: 04/16/14 2 Effective: 04/27/14 3 4 SNOHOMISH COUNTY COUNCIL 5 SNOHOMISH COUNTY, WASHINGTON 6 7 ORDINANCE NO. 14-006 8 9 RELATING TO THE GROWTH MANAGEMENT ACT, AMENDING THE INITIAL 2035 GROWTH 10 TARGETS IN APPENDIX B OF THE COUNTYWIDE PLANNING POLICIES FOR SNOHOMISH 11 COUNTY BY RE-TITLING AND RE-ORDERING POPULATION AND EMPLOYMENT GROWTH 12 TARGET TABLES AND BY ADDING HOUSING GROWTH TARGETS PURSUANT TO THE 13 RECOMMENDATION OF SNOHOMISH COUNTY TOMORROW 14 15 WHEREAS, the Growth Management Act (GMA), RCW 36.70A.210(2), requires the legislative authority of each county which is subject to the GMA's comprehensive planning 16 17 requirements to adopt a countywide planning policy (CPP) framework in cooperation with the cities and towns within that county, and from which the county, city and town comprehensive 18 19 plans are developed and adopted; and 20 21 WHEREAS, RCW 36.70A.210 also requires that the CPPs govern interjurisdictional 22 consistency of county and city planning efforts and implementation of GMA requirements for 23 designating urban growth areas (UGAs), including the establishment of 20-year growth 24 allocations used as the basis for designating UGAs; and 25 26 WHEREAS, Snohomish County (County) adopted revised CPPs through Amended 27 Ordinance Nos. 11-011, 11-015 and 11-021, effective June 24, 2011, through Ordinance No. 12-070, effective November 10, 2012, and through Amended Ordinance No. 13-032, effective June 28 29 30, 2013; and 30 31 WHEREAS, CPP GF-5 requires that the cities and County engage in the cooperative 32 planning process of Snohomish County Tomorrow (SCT) to establish a subcounty allocation of projected growth for coordination of city and County growth management plans, using the State 33 Office of Financial Management's (OFM) population projections for Snohomish County and the 34 35 numeric guidance provided by the Puget Sound Regional Council's (PSRC) Vision 2040 36 Regional Growth Strategy (RGS) as a starting point for this effort; and 37 38 WHEREAS, following an extensive SCT effort through the Planning Advisory 39 Committee (PAC), culminating in a recommendation by the SCT Steering Committee, the 40 County Council adopted Amended Ordinance No. 13-032 amending Appendix B of the CPPs by 41 establishing initial 2035 growth targets for population and employment; and

WHEREAS, CPP GF-5 calls for use of the SCT process to develop 2035 housing targets for cities, unincorporated UGAs, and unincorporated municipal urban growth areas (MUGAs),

and the rural/resource area, consistent with PSRC Multicounty Planning Policy (MPP) MPP-DP-3; and

WHEREAS, in 2012 the PAC of SCT, through its housing subcommittee, began the process of preparing a new housing report, as required by CPP HO-5 and including the development of initial housing growth targets; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2013, the PAC received the draft report and housing growth targets from its housing subcommittee and, at its November 14, 2013, meeting, recommended to the SCT Steering Committee that it accept the new report, entitled *Housing Characteristics and Needs Report*, and recommend adoption of the initial housing growth targets for inclusion into Appendix B of the CPPs; and

WHEREAS, on November 20, 2013, the SCT Steering Committee received and was briefed on the new report and the PAC recommendation; and

WHEREAS, on January 14, 2014, the SCT Executive Committee recommended that the Steering Committee adopt the PAC recommendation to accept the report and to recommend the initial 2035 housing growth targets for adoption by the County Council; and

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2014, the SCT Steering Committee recommended that the PAC recommendation be forwarded to the County Council for adoption of the initial 2035 housing growth targets; and

WHEREAS, CPP GF-5 and Appendix C require that the County Council consider the recommendation of the SCT Steering Committee on the subcounty allocation of growth for cities, unincorporated UGAs, unincorporated MUGAs, and the rural/resource area of the county, and adopt 20-year GMA growth targets into Appendix B of the CPPs; and

 WHEREAS, the County Council held a public hearing on April 16, 2014, to consider the entire record, including the SCT Steering Committee recommendation on the 2035 initial housing growth targets for adoption into Appendix B of the CPPs, and to hear public testimony on this Ordinance No. 14-006.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. The County Council makes the following findings of fact:

- A. The County Council adopts and incorporates the foregoing recitals as findings as if set forth fully herein.
- B. The revisions would expand the initial growth targets contained in Appendix B of the CPPs to include initial 2035 housing growth targets to complement the adopted 2035 initial population and employment growth targets, add the word "Initial" to the titles of Tables 1-4

- in Appendix B, and re-order the tables to group population, employment, and housing growth targets.
- C. The County Council adopts and incorporates the following findings of fact related to the SCT process for developing this CPP amendment:
- In 2012 SCT engaged the services of Berk Consulting (Berk) to assist the PAC in the development of a methodology for the preparation of the new housing report called for by CPP HO-5.
 - 2. From May 2012 through February 2013 Berk conducted five meetings with the PAC housing subcommittee and one meeting with the full PAC towards the development of a methodology to create a streamlined and user-friendly report to meet the mandates of the GMA and the specifications of CPP HO-5.
 - 3. On February 14, 2013, the PAC directed its housing subcommittee to proceed with the preparation of the report using the methodology recommended by Berk, and including the formulation of initial 2035 housing growth targets.
 - 4. During the preparation of the report from March through September, 2013, the housing subcommittee also worked to develop a method of converting the initial 2035 population growth targets to housing growth targets. This process started with a conversion method used by the PSRC at the regional scale, but was refined through adjustments to reflect the specific circumstances of Snohomish County and its cities.
 - 5. After several iterations, a mathematical conversion formula was finalized that reflects individual jurisdictions' historical trends in their average household size in relation to the ratio of single-family and multi-family units in its housing stock, as well as estimated remaining residential capacity in each of the county's jurisdictions based on the results of the 2012 *Buildable Land Report*.
 - 6. The initial housing growth targets are based on the most recent official 20-year population projections for Snohomish County from the OFM, the PSRC's most recent population and employment distribution as represented in the VISION 2040 RGS, and further distribution of the population and employment RGS allocations to jurisdictions in each of the PSRC regional geographies in Snohomish County.
- 7. On November 14, 2013, after having the draft report and housing growth targets to review for 6 weeks, the PAC recommended acceptance of the report and adoption of the initial 2035 housing growth targets.
 - 8. It is appropriate to re-title Tables 1-4, as suggested during the subcommittee review of the SCT Steering Committee agenda bill, as <u>Initial</u> 2035 Growth Targets, since the tables contain <u>initial</u> growth targets identified in CPP GF-5 and Appendix C of the CPPs.
- D. The Appendix B initial 2035 housing growth targets are derived from, and are therefore consistent with the initial 2035 population growth targets adopted by the County Council on June 12, 2013.

- 1 E. The Appendix B initial 2035 housing growth targets are consistent with CPP GF-5 and
- 2 Appendix C requirements regarding the establishment of new 20-year GMA initial growth
- 3 targets, required to be used for at least one of the plan alternatives evaluated by cities and the
- 4 county during development of the local GMA comprehensive plan updates required under
- 5 GMA by June 30, 2015.
- F. With the addition of two new tables, it is appropriate for logical sequencing to re-order the tables within Appendix B to start with the two population tables, followed by the two
- 8 employment tables and concluding with the two housing tables.
- 9 G. This amendment complies with the substantive requirements of the GMA, including RCW
- 10 36.70A.110(2) which states that the county shall coordinate with the cities on the location
- and amount of projected 20-year growth for purposes of ensuring adequate capacity within
- the UGA to accommodate the projected urban growth.
- H. This amendment to Appendix B of the CPPs is consistent with the PSRC RGS contained in the *Vision 2040* regional plan.
- 15 I. This amendment to Appendix B of the CPPs is consistent with PSRC's MPP-G-1 regarding coordination of planning efforts among jurisdictions.
- J. This amendment complies with the procedural requirements of the GMA, including the public participation provisions in RCW 36.70A.035 and .140.
- 19 K. No inconsistencies between this amendment and the GMA have been identified.
- 20 L. No inconsistencies between this amendment and the CPPs have been identified.
- 21 M. The Washington State Attorney General issued an advisory memorandum in December of
- 22 2006 entitled Advisory Memorandum: Avoiding Unconstitutional Takings of Private
- Property to help local governments avoid the unconstitutional taking of private property. The
- 24 2006 advisory memorandum was used by the county in objectively evaluating the
- amendments proposed by this ordinance. This amendment to the CPPs do not result in or
- direct the adoption of policies or regulations that would result in the unconstitutional taking of private property or violate substantive due process guarantees.
- N. Appropriate public participation has been provided through the SCT process and through a public hearing on this ordinance held by the Snohomish County Council after public notice
- 30 on April 16, 2014.
- O. SEPA requirements for this non-project action have been met through Snohomish County's
- Addendum No. 6 to the PSRC Vision 2040 Final Environmental Impact Statement, issued on
- 33 March 26, 2014.

35 Section 2. The County Council makes the following conclusions:

A. This amendment amends the initial 2035 growth targets tables contained in Appendix B of the CPPs by adding initial housing growth targets, re-titling Tables 1-4, and re-ordering the

- tables to group population, employment, and housing growth targets, as set forth in Exhibit A of this ordinance.
- 3 B. This amendment is consistent with the policies of the CPPs for Snohomish County.
- 4 C. This amendment to the CPPs satisfies the procedural and substantive requirements of the GMA.
- D. This amendment, as set forth in Exhibit A, increases consistency between the CPPs and
 PSRC's *Vision 2040* Regional Growth Strategy.
- 8 E. This amendment to the CPPs does not result in the unconstitutional taking of private property or violate substantive due process guarantees.
- 10 F. The County has complied with the procedural requirements of SEPA.
- G. The County has complied with state and local public participation requirements under the GMA and chapter 30.73 SCC by broadly disseminating the amendments and providing opportunities for written comments and public hearing after public notice.

Section 3. The County Council bases its findings and conclusions on the entire record before SCT and the County Council, including all testimony and exhibits, and including the public record for Amended Ordinance 13-032 that adopted initial 2035 population and employment growth targets on June 12, 2013. Any finding, which should be deemed a conclusion, and any conclusion which should be deemed a finding, is hereby adopted as such.

Section 4. Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, the contents of Appendix B of the Countywide Planning Policies for Snohomish County, last amended by Amended Ordinance No. 13-032 on June 12, 2013, are repealed and replaced with Exhibit A to this ordinance, which is attached hereto and incorporated by reference into this ordinance as if set forth in full.

Section 5. The County Council directs the Code Reviser to update SCC 30.10.050 pursuant to SCC 1.02.020(3).

Section 6. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance shall be held to be invalid by the Growth Management Hearings Board, or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance. Provided, however, that if any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid by the Board or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, then the section, sentence, clause or phrase in effect prior to the effective date of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect for that individual section, sentence, clause or phrase as if this ordinance had never been adopted.
