6 AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 16-039

7
8 RELATING TO GROWTH MANAGEMENT, REVISING REGULATIONS FOR
9 MARIJUANA BUSINESSES, AMENDING SECTIONS 30.22.100, 30.22.110 AND
10 30.22.130 OF THE SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE

11
12 WHEREAS, the Growth Management Act, Chapter 36.70A RCW (“GMA”),
13 requires Snohomish County (“County”) to regulate land use and development within the
14 County’s jurisdiction; and

15
16 WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Council adopted regulations for marijuana-
17 related facilities in Amended Ordinance No. 13-086 effective November 28, 2013; and

18
19 WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Council amended regulations for marijuana-
20 related facilities in Amended Ordinance No. 15-009 effective June 15, 2015; and

21
22 WHEREAS, during adoption of amendments to Chapter 30.22 SCC in Amended
23 Ordinance No. 15-009, reference note 124 was applied to the Marijuana Retail and
24 Marijuana Collective Garden Dispensary or Access Point uses in the rural and resource
25 use matrix; and

26
27 WHEREAS, the addition of reference note 124 in Amended Ordinance 15-009
28 was intended to prohibit Marijuana Retail and Marijuana Collective Garden Dispensary
29 or Access Point uses on the Tulalip Indian Reservation; and

30
31 WHEREAS, the application of reference note 124 to Marijuana Retail in the rural
32 and resource use matrix had the unintended consequence of requiring a minimum lot
33 size of 100,000 square feet for Marijuana Retail; and

34
35 WHEREAS, although amendments to Amended Ordinance 15-009 were
36 intended to prohibit all marijuana-related facilities within the exterior boundaries of the
37 Tulalip Indian Reservation, the amendments only partially implemented that intent;

38
39 WHEREAS, this ordinance does not address the legality of the conduct
40 associated with marijuana and should not be construed as approval of such uses or
41 waiver of any applicable county, state, or federal laws; and

42
43 WHEREAS, the Snohomish County Planning Commission (“Planning
44 Commission”) held a briefing on March 22, 2016, concerning the code amendments
45 contained in this ordinance; and

47 WHEREAS, the Planning Commission held a public hearing on April 26, 2016, to
48 receive public testimony concerning the code amendments contained in this ordinance;
49 and

50
51 WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the Planning Commission's public hearing, the
52 Planning Commission voted to recommend approval of the proposal without
53 amendment, as set forth in its recommendation letter dated April 27, 2016; and

54
55 WHEREAS, on June 22, 2016, the County Council held a public hearing after
56 proper notice, and considered public comments and the entire record related to the
57 code amendments contained in this ordinance; and

58
59 WHEREAS, following the public hearing, the County Council deliberated on the
60 code amendments contained in this ordinance;

61
62 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

63
64 Section 1. The Snohomish County Council makes the following findings and
65 conclusions:

- 66
67 A. The Snohomish County Council adopts and incorporates the foregoing recitals as
68 findings as if set forth fully herein.
69
70 B. Proposed Ordinance No. 15-009 was amended through a series of amendments,
71 resulting in Amended Ordinance No. 15-009 as adopted. One such amendment was
72 Amendment 7, described as follows: "This amendment would prohibit marijuana-
73 related facilities within the exterior boundaries of the Tulalip Indian Reservation."
74 The intent of this amendment to restrict marijuana-related facilities within the
75 boundaries of the reservation was not limited to rural lands. However, only the rural
76 and resource use matrix was amended to reflect that intent. This ordinance would
77 amend the urban zone categories use matrix to give full effect to the legislative intent
78 of Amendment 7.
79
80 C. There was no legislative intent to apply a 100,000 square-foot lot size requirement to
81 the use of Marijuana Retail, a use that is permitted in the Rural Business zone.
82 Amendment 7 applied reference note 124 to Marijuana Retail in the rural and
83 resource use matrix, which had the effect of applying such a lot size requirement to
84 Marijuana Retail in the Rural Business zone. This ordinance would remove that
85 requirement, giving effect to the legislative intent of Amendment 7.
86
87 D. This ordinance satisfies the procedural and substantive requirements of and is
88 consistent with the GMA and the following goals, objectives and policies contained in
89 the Snohomish County Growth Management Act Comprehensive Plan (GMACP)
90 General Policy Plan (GPP):
91

- 92 1. Goal Economic Development (ED) 1: "Maintain and enhance a healthy
93 economy."
94
95 2. Objective ED 2.A: "Develop and maintain a regulatory system that is fair,
96 understandable, coordinated and timely."
97
98 3. ED Policy 2.A.1: "Snohomish County shall work to ensure that the Snohomish
99 County Code is an understandable, accessible, and user friendly document."
100
101 4. ED Policy 2.A.2: "Snohomish County should stress predictability but maintain
102 enough flexibility in the Comprehensive Plan and development codes to allow for
103 timely response to unanticipated and desirable developments."
104

105 E. Procedural requirements.

- 106
107 1. The ordinance is a Type 3 legislative action pursuant to SCC 30.73.010 and is
108 consistent with state law and chapter 30.73 SCC.
109
110 2. SEPA requirements with respect to this non-project action are satisfied through
111 the completion of an environmental checklist and the issuance of a Determination
112 of Nonsignificance on April 21, 2016.
113
114 3. A notice of intent to adopt this ordinance was transmitted to the Washington
115 State Department of Commerce for distribution to state agencies on March 17,
116 2016.
117
118 4. The public participation process used for the proposed code amendments has
119 complied with all applicable requirements of the GMA and the SCC.
120
121 5. The Washington State Attorney General last issued an advisory memorandum,
122 as required by RCW 36.70A.370, in December of 2015 entitled "Advisory
123 Memorandum and Recommended Process for Evaluating Proposed Regulatory
124 or Administrative Actions to Avoid Unconstitutional Takings of Private Property"
125 to help local governments avoid the unconstitutional taking of private property.
126 The process outlined in the State Attorney General's 2015 advisory
127 memorandum was used by Snohomish County in objectively evaluating the
128 regulatory changes proposed by this proposal.
129

130 F. This ordinance is consistent with the record.

- 131
132 1. This ordinance will amend SCC 30.22.100 (Urban Zone Categories: Use Matrix)
133 to add new reference note 131 prohibiting marijuana-related facilities in urban
134 zones within the exterior boundaries of the Tulalip Indian Reservation.
135
136 2. This ordinance will amend SCC 30.22.110 (Rural and Resource Use Matrix) to:
137 (1) remove reference note 124 from the use column for "Marijuana Collective

138 Garden Dispensary, or Access Point” and “Marijuana Retail,” and (2) add new
139 reference note 131 prohibiting marijuana-related facilities in rural and resource
140 zones within the exterior boundaries of the Tulalip Indian Reservation.
141

- 142 3. This ordinance will amend SCC 30.22.130 (Reference notes for use matrix) to:
143 (1) repeal the Tulalip restriction from the text of reference note 124; and (2)
144 create new reference note 131 prohibiting marijuana-related facilities within the
145 exterior boundaries of the Tulalip Indian Reservation.
146

147 Section 2. The County Council makes the following conclusions:

- 148 A. The proposal complies with all requirements of county code.
149
150 B. The proposal is consistent with the goals, objectives and policies of the
151 GMACP.
152
153 C. The county complied with all SEPA requirements in respect to this non-
154 project action.
155
156 D. The regulations proposed by this ordinance do not result in an
157 unconstitutional taking of private property for public purposes.
158
159 E. The county complied with state and local public participation requirements
160 under the GMA and chapter 30.73 SCC.
161
162

163 Section 3. The County Council bases its findings and conclusions on the entire
164 record of the County Council, including all testimony and exhibits. Any finding, which
165 should be deemed a conclusion, and any conclusion which should be deemed a finding,
166 is hereby adopted as such.
167

168 Section 4. Emergency Ordinance No. 16-006, adopted on January 20, 2016, is
169 repealed.
170

171 Section 5. Snohomish County Code Section 30.22.100, last amended by
172 Emergency Ordinance No. 16-051 on June 22, 2016, is amended to read:

5 (1) Airport, Stage 1 Utility:

- 6 (a) Not for commercial use and for use of small private planes;
- 7 (b) In the RU zone, they shall be primarily for the use of the resident property
- 8 owner; and
- 9 (c) When the airport is included in an airpark, the disclosure requirements of SCC
- 10 30.28.005 shall apply.

11 (2) Day Care Center:

- 12 (a) In WFB, R-7,200, R-8,400, R-9,600, R-12,500, R-20,000, and SA-1 zones,
- 13 shall only be permitted in connection with and secondary to a school facility or
- 14 place of worship; and
- 15 (b) Outdoor play areas shall be fenced or otherwise controlled, and noise buffering

- 26 (27) Governmental and Utility Structures and Facilities:
27 Special lot area requirements for this use are contained in SCC 30.23.200.
- 28 (28) Excavation and Processing of Minerals:
- 29 (a) This use, as described in SCC 30.31D.010(2), is allowed in the identified zones
30 only where these zones coincide with the mineral lands designation in the
31 comprehensive plan (mineral resource overlay or MRO), except for the MC zone
32 where mineral lands designation is not required.
- 33 (b) An Administrative Conditional Use Permit or a Conditional Use Permit is
34 required pursuant to SCC 30.31D.030.
- 35 (c) Excavation and processing of minerals exclusively in conjunction with forest
36 practices regulated pursuant to chapter 76.09 RCW is permitted outright in the
37 Forestry zone.
- 38 (29) Medical Clinic, Licensed Practitioner: A prescription pharmacy may be permitted
39 when located within the main building containing licensed practitioner(s).
- 40 (30) Forest Industry Storage & Maintenance Facility (except harvesting) adjacent to
41 property lines in the RU zone shall provide 15-foot wide Type A landscaping as defined
42 in SCC 30.25.017.
- 43 (31) Boat Launch Facilities, Commercial or Non-commercial:
- 44 (a) The hearing examiner may regulate, among other factors, required launching
45 depth, lengths of existing docks and piers;

- (b) Off-street parking shall be provided in an amount suitable to the expected usage of the facility. When used by the general public, the guideline should be 32 to 40 spaces capable of accommodating both a car and boat trailer for each ramp lane of boat access to the water;
- (c) A level vehicle-maneuvering space measuring at least 50 feet square shall be provided;
- (d) Pedestrian access to the water separate from the boat launching lane or lanes may be required where it is deemed necessary in the interest of public safety;
- (e) Safety buoys shall be installed and maintained separating boating activities from other water-oriented recreation and uses where this is reasonably required for public safety, welfare, and health; and
- (f) All site improvements for boat launch facilities shall comply with all other requirements of the zone in which it is located.

(32) Campground:

- (a) The maximum overall density shall be seven camp or tent sites per acre in Forestry and Recreation (F&R) zoning and two camp or tent sites per acre in Forestry (F) zoning;
- (b) The minimum site size shall be 10 acres; and

- (a) The distillation shall be from plant products, for the purpose of sale as fuel, and for the production of methane from animal waste produced on the premises;
- (b) Such distillation shall be only one of several products of normal agricultural activities occurring on the premises; and
- (c) By-products created in this process shall be used for fuel or fertilizer on the premises.

(35) RESERVED for future use (Group Care Facility - DELETED by Amended Ord. 04-010 effective March 15, 2004)

(36) Mobile Home and Travel Trailer Sales:

- (a) Property shall directly front upon a principal or minor arterial in order to reduce encroachment into the interior of IP designated areas;
- (b) The hearing examiner shall consider the visual and aesthetic characteristics of the use proposal and determine whether nearby business and industrial uses, existing or proposed, would be potentially harmed thereby. A finding of potential incompatibility shall be grounds for denial;
- (c) The conditional use permit shall include a condition requiring mandatory review by the hearing examiner at intervals not to exceed five years for the express purpose of evaluating the continued compatibility of the use with other IP uses.

1 The review required herein is in addition to any review which may be held pursuant
2 to SCC 30.42B.100, 30.42C.100 and 30.43A.100;

3 (d) Such use shall not be deemed to be outside storage for the purpose of SCC
4 30.25.024; and

5 (e) Such use shall be temporary until business or industrial development is timely
6 on the site or on nearby IP designated property.

7 (37) Small Animal Husbandry: There shall be a five-acre minimum site size.

8 (38) Mobile Home Park: Such development must fulfill the requirements of chapter
9 30.42E SCC.

10 (39) Sludge Utilization: See SCC 30.28.085.

11 (40) Homestead Parcel: See SCC 30.28.055.

12 (41) Special Setback Requirements for this use are contained in SCC 30.23.110 or
13 30.67.515 if within shoreline jurisdiction.

14 (42) Minimum Lot Size for duplexes shall be one and one-half times the minimum lot
15 size for single family dwellings. In the RU zone, this provision only applies when the
16 minimum lot size for single family dwellings is 12,500 square feet or less.

17 (43) Petroleum Products and Gas, Bulk Storage:

18 (a) All above ground storage tanks shall be located 150 feet from all property lines;
19 and

20 (b) Storage tanks below ground shall be located no closer to the property line than
21 a distance equal to the greatest dimensions (diameter, length or height) of the
22 buried tank.

23 (44) Auto Wrecking Yards and Junkyards: A sight-obscuring fence a minimum of seven
24 feet high shall be established and maintained in the LI zone. For requirements for this
25 use, SCC 30.25.020 and 30.25.050 apply.

26 (45) Antique Shops: When established as a home occupation as regulated by SCC
27 30.28.050(1); provided further that all merchandise sold or offered for sale shall be
28 predominantly "antique" and antique-related objects.

29 (46) Billboards: See SCC 30.27.080 for specific requirements.

30 (47) Nursery, Wholesale: In R-20,000 zone, a wholesale nursery is permitted on three
31 acres or more; a conditional use permit is required on less than three acres.

32 (48) Stockyard and Livestock Auction Facility: The minimum lot size is 10 acres.

33 (49) Restaurants and Personal Service Shops: Located to service principally the
34 constructed industrial park uses.

35 (50) Sludge Utilization: A conditional use permit is required for manufacture of materials
36 by a non-governmental agency containing stabilized or digested sludge for a public
37 utilization.

38 (51) Single Family and Multifamily Dwellings: A prohibited use, except for the following:

39 (a) Existing dwellings that are nonconforming as a result of a county-initiated
40 rezone to BP may make improvements or additions provided such improvements
41 are consistent with the bulk regulations contained in chapter 30.23 SCC; provided
42 further that such improvements do not increase the ground area covered by the
43 structural portion of the nonconforming use by more than 100 percent of that
44 existing at the existing date of the nonconformance; and

45 (b) New single family and multifamily dwellings in the BP zone authorized pursuant
46 to the provisions of SCC 30.31A.140.

- 1 (52) Greenhouses, Lath Houses, and Nurseries:
2 (a) Incidental sale of soil, bark, fertilizers, plant nutrients, rocks, and similar plant
3 husbandry materials is permitted;
4 (b) Incidental sale of garden tools and associated gardening accessories shall be
5 permitted; however, the sale of motorized landscaping equipment such as lawn
6 mowers, weed eaters, edgers, and rototillers shall be prohibited;
7 (c) There shall be no on-site signs advertising uses other than the principal use;
8 and
9 (d) Incidental sales of garden tools and associated gardening accessories shall be
10 less than 25 percent of the sales of products produced in the greenhouse, lath
11 house, or nursery.
- 12 (53) Retail Store: See SCC 30.31A.120 for specific requirements for retail stores in the
13 BP zone.
- 14 (54) Retail Sales of Hay, Grain, and Other Livestock Feed are permitted on site in
15 conjunction with a livestock auction facility.
- 16 (55) Noise of Machines and Operations in the LI and HI zones shall comply with chapter

- 19 (56) Sludge Utilization: Only at a completed sanitary landfill or on a completed cell
20 within a sanitary landfill, subject to the provision of SCC 30.28.085.
- 21 (57) Woodwaste Recycling and Woodwaste Storage Facility: See SCC 30.28.095.
- 22 (58) Bed and Breakfast Guesthouses and Bed and Breakfast Inns: See SCC 30.28.020.
- 23 (59) Detached Accessory or Non-Accessory Private Garages and Storage Structures:
24 Subject to the following requirements:
- 25 (a) Special setback requirements for these uses are contained in SCC
26 30.23.110(20);
- 27 (b) Artificial lighting shall be hooded or shaded so that direct outside lighting, if any,
28 will not result in glare when viewed from the surrounding property or rights-of-way;
- 29 (c) The following compatibility standards shall apply:
- 30 (i) proposals for development in existing neighborhoods with a well-defined
31 character should be compatible with or complement the highest quality
32 features, architectural character and siting pattern of neighboring buildings.
33 Where there is no discernable pattern, the buildings shall complement the
34 neighborhood. Development of detached private garages and storage
35 structures shall not interrupt the streetscape or dwarf the scale of existing
36 buildings of existing neighborhoods. Applicants may refer to the Residential
37 Development Handbook for Snohomish County Communities to review
38 techniques recommended to achieve neighborhood compatibility;
- 39 (ii) building plans for all proposals larger than 2,400 square feet in the
40 Waterfront Beach, R-7,200, R-8,400, R-9,600 and R-12,500 zones and rural
41 cluster subdivisions shall document the use of building materials compatible
42 and consistent with existing on-site residential development exterior finishes;
- 43 (iii) in the Waterfront Beach, R-7,200, R-8,400, R-9,600 and R-12,500 zones
44 and rural cluster subdivisions, no portion of a detached accessory private
45 garage or storage structure shall extend beyond the building front of the

1 existing single family dwelling, unless screening, landscaping, or other
2 measures are provided to ensure compatibility with adjacent properties; and
3 (iv) in the Waterfront Beach, R-7,200, R-8,400, R-9,600 and R-12,500 zones
4 and rural cluster subdivisions, no portion of a detached non-accessory private
5 garage or storage structure shall extend beyond the building front of existing
6 single family dwellings on adjacent lots where the adjacent dwellings are
7 located within 10 feet of the subject property line. When a detached non-
8 accessory private garage or storage structure is proposed, the location of
9 existing dwellings on adjacent properties located within 10 feet of the subject
10 site property lines shall be shown on the site plan;

11 (d) All detached accessory or non-accessory private garages and storage
12 structures proposed with building footprints larger than 2,400 square feet shall
13 provide screening or landscaping from adjacent properties pursuant to chapter
14 30.25 SCC;

15 (e) On lots less than 10 acres in size having no established residential use, only
16 one non-accessory private garage and one storage structure shall be allowed. On
17 lots 10 acres or larger without a residence where the cumulative square footage of
18 all existing and proposed non-accessory private garages and storage structures is
19 6,000 square feet or larger, a conditional use permit shall be required.

20 (f) Where permitted, separation between multiple private garages or storage
21 structures shall be regulated pursuant to subtitle 30.5 SCC.

22 (60) The cumulative square footage of all detached accessory and non-accessory
23 private garages and storage structures shall not exceed 6,000 square feet on any lot
24 less than five acres, except this provision shall not apply in the LDMR, MR, T, NB, GC,
25 PCB, CB, FS, BP, IP, LI, HI, RB, RFS, CRC and RI zones.

26 (61) Museums: Museums within the agriculture A-10 zone are permitted only in
27 structures which were legally existing on October 31, 1991.

28 (62) Accessory Apartments: See SCC 30.28.010.

29 (63) Temporary Woodwaste Recycling and Temporary Woodwaste Storage Facilities:
30 See SCC 30.28.090.

31 (64) RESERVED for future use.

32 (65) On-Site Hazardous Waste Treatment and Storage Facilities: Allowed only as an
33 incidental use to any use generating hazardous waste which is otherwise allowed;
34 provided that such facilities demonstrate compliance with the state siting criteria for
35 dangerous waste management facilities pursuant to RCW 70.105.210 and WAC 173-
36 303-282 as now written or hereafter amended.

37 (66) An application for a conditional use permit to allow an off-site hazardous waste
38 treatment and storage facility shall demonstrate compliance with the state siting criteria
39 for dangerous waste management facilities pursuant to RCW 70.105.210 and WAC
40 173-303-282 as now written or hereafter amended.

41 (67) Adult Entertainment Uses: See SCC 30.28.015.

42 (68) Special Building Height provisions for this use are contained in SCC
43 30.23.050(2)(d).

44 (69) Bakery: In the NB zone, the gross floor area of the use shall not exceed 1,000
45 square feet and the bakery business shall be primarily retail in nature.

1 (70) Equestrian Centers: Allowed with a conditional use permit on all lands zoned A-10
2 except in that portion of the special flood hazard area of the lower Snohomish and
3 Stillaguamish rivers designated density fringe as described in chapter 30.65 SCC.

4 (71) Mini-Equestrian Centers are allowed as a permitted use on all lands zoned A-10
5 except in that portion of the special flood hazard area of the lower Snohomish and
6 Stillaguamish rivers designated density fringe as described in chapter 30.65 SCC.

7 (72) Equestrian Centers and Mini-equestrian Centers require the following:

8 (a) Five-acre minimum site size for a mini-equestrian center;

9 (b) Covered riding arenas shall not exceed 15,000 square feet for a mini-
10 equestrian center; provided that stabling areas, whether attached or detached,
11 shall not be included in this calculation;

12 (c) Any lighting of an outdoor or covered arena shall be shielded so as not to glare
13 on surrounding properties or rights-of-way;

14 (d) On sites located in RC and R-5 zones, Type A landscaping as defined in SCC
15 30.25.017 is required to screen any outside storage, including animal waste
16 storage, and parking areas from adjacent properties;

17 (e) Riding lessons, rentals, or shows shall only occur between 8:00 a.m. and 9:00
18 p.m.;

19 (f) Outside storage, including animal waste storage, and parking areas shall be set
20 back at least 30 feet from any adjacent property line. All structures shall be set
21 back as required in SCC 30.23.110(8); and

22 (g) The facility shall comply with all applicable county building, health, and fire
23 code requirements.

24 (73) Temporary Residential Sales Coach (TRSC):

25 (a) The commercial coach shall be installed in accordance with all applicable
26 provisions within chapter 30.54A SCC;

27 (b) The TRSC shall be set back a minimum of 20 feet from all existing and
28 proposed road rights-of-way and five feet from proposed and existing property
29 lines;

30 (c) Vehicular access to the temporary residential sales coach shall be approved by
31 the county or state; and

32 (d) Temporary residential sales coaches may be permitted in approved preliminary
33 plats, prior to final plat approval, when the following additional conditions have
34 been met:

35 (i) plat construction plans have been approved;

36 (ii) the fire marshal has approved the TRSC proposal;

37 (iii) proposed lot lines for the subject lot are marked on site; and

38 (iv) the site has been inspected for TRSC installation to verify compliance with
39 all applicable regulations and plat conditions, and to assure that land
40 disturbing activity, drainage, utilities infrastructure, and native growth
41 protection areas are not adversely affected.

42 (74) Golf Course and Driving Range: In the A-10 zone, artificial lighting of the golf
43 course or driving range shall not be allowed. Land disturbing activity shall be limited in
44 order to preserve prime farmland. At least 75 percent of prime farmland on site shall
45 remain undisturbed.

46 (75) Model Hobby Park: SCC 30.28.060.

1 (76) Commercial Retail Uses: Not allowed in the Light Industrial and Industrial Park
2 zones when said zones are located in the Maltby UGA of the comprehensive plan, and
3 where such properties are, or can be served by railway spur lines.

4 (77) Studio: Studio uses may require the imposition of special conditions to ensure
5 compatibility with adjacent residential, multiple family, or rural-zoned properties. The
6 hearing examiner may impose such conditions when deemed necessary pursuant to the
7 provisions of chapter 30.42C SCC. The following criteria are provided for hearing
8 examiner consideration when specific circumstances necessitate the imposition of
9 conditions:

10 (a) The number of nonresident artists and professionals permitted to use a studio
11 at the same time may be limited to no more than 10 for any lot 200,000 square feet
12 or larger in size, and limited to five for any lot less than 200,000 square feet in size;

13 (b) The hours of facility operation may be limited; and

14 (c) Landscape buffers may be required to visually screen facility structures or
15 outdoor storage areas when the structures or outdoor storage areas are proposed
16 within 100 feet of adjacent residential, multiple family, and rural-zoned properties.

17 The buffer shall be an effective site obscuring screen consistent with Type A
18 landscaping as defined in SCC 30.25.017.

19 (78) The gross floor area of the use shall not exceed 1,000 square feet.

20 (79) The gross floor area of the use shall not exceed 2,000 square feet.

21 (80) The gross floor area of the use shall not exceed 4,000 square feet.

22 (81) The construction contracting use in the Rural Business zone shall be subject to the
23 following requirements:

24 (a) The use complies with all of the performance standards required by SCC
25 30.31F.100 and 30.31F.110;

26 (b) Not more than 1,000 square feet of outdoor storage of materials shall be
27 allowed and shall be screened in accordance with SCC 30.25.024;

28 (c) In addition to the provisions of subsection (81)(b) of this section, not more than
29 five commercial vehicles or construction machines shall be stored outdoors and
30 shall be screened in accordance with SCC 30.25.020 and 30.25.032;

31 (d) The on-site fueling of vehicles shall be prohibited; and

32 (e) The storage of inoperable vehicles and hazardous or earth materials shall be
33 prohibited.

34 (82) Manufacturing, Heavy includes the following uses: Distillation of wood, coal, bones,
35 or the manufacture of their by-products; explosives manufacturing; manufacture of
36 fertilizer; extraction of animal or fish fat or oil; forge, foundry, blast furnace or melting of
37 ore; manufacturing of acid, animal black/black bone, cement or lime, chlorine, creosote,
38 fertilizer, glue or gelatin, potash, pulp; rendering of fat, tallow and lard, rolling or
39 booming mills; tannery; or tar distillation and manufacturing. See SCC 30.91M.028.

40 (83) "All other forms of manufacture not specifically listed" is a category which uses
41 manufacturing workers, as described under the Dictionary of Occupational Titles,
42 published by the US Department of Labor, to produce, assemble or create products and
43 which the director finds consistent with generally accepted practices and performance
44 standards for the industrial zone where the use is proposed. See SCC 30.91M.024 and
45 30.91M.026.

46 (84) RESERVED for future use.

- 1 (85) A single family dwelling may have only one guesthouse.
- 2 (86) Outdoor display or storage of goods and products is prohibited on site.
- 3 (87) Wedding Facility:
- 4 (a) Such use is permitted only:
- 5 (i) on vacant and undeveloped land;
- 6 (ii) on developed land, but entirely outside of any permanent structure;
- 7 (iii) partially outside of permanent structures and partially inside of one or
- 8 more permanent structures which were legally existing on January 1, 2001; or
- 9 (iv) entirely inside of one or more permanent structures which were legally
- 10 existing on January 1, 2001;
- 11 (b) The applicant shall demonstrate that the following criteria are met with respect
- 12 to the activities related to the use:
- 13 (i) compliance with the noise control provisions of chapter 10.01 SCC;
- 14 (ii) adequate vehicular site distance and safe turning movements exist at the
- 15 access to the site consistent with the EDDS as defined in Title 13 SCC; and
- 16 (iii) adequate sanitation facilities are provided on site pursuant to chapter
- 17 30.50 SCC and applicable Snohomish Health District provisions;
- 18 (c) Adequate on-site parking shall be provided for the use pursuant to SCC
- 19 30.26.035; and
- 20 (d) A certificate of occupancy shall be obtained pursuant to chapter 30.50 SCC for
- 21 the use of any existing structure.
- 22 (88) Public/Institutional Use Designation (P/IU): When applied to land that is (a)
- 23 included in an Urban Growth Area and (b) designated P/IU on the Snohomish County
- 24 Future Land Use Map concurrent with or prior to its inclusion in a UGA, the R-7,200, R-
- 25 8,400 and R-9,600 zones shall allow only the following permitted or conditional uses:
- 26 churches, and school instructional facilities. All other uses are prohibited within areas
- 27 that meet criteria (a) and (b), unless the P/IU designation is changed.
- 28 (89) Hotel/Motel Uses: Permitted in the Light Industrial zone when the following criteria
- 29 are met:
- 30 (a) The Light Industrial zone is located within a municipal airport boundary;
- 31 (b) The municipal airport boundary includes no less than 1,000 acres of land zoned
- 32 light industrial; and
- 33 (c) The hotel/motel use is served by both public water and sewer.
- 34 (90) Health and Social Service Facilities regulated under this title do not include secure
- 35 community transition facilities (SCTFs) proposed pursuant to chapter 71.09 RCW. See
- 36 SCC 30.91H.095.
- 37 (a) Snohomish County is preempted from regulation of SCTFs. In accordance with
- 38 the requirements of state law the county shall take all reasonable steps permitted
- 39 by chapter 71.09 RCW to ensure that SCTFs comply with applicable siting criteria
- 40 of state law. Every effort shall be made by the county through the available state
- 41 procedures to ensure strict compliance with all relevant public safety concerns,
- 42 such as emergency response time, minimum distances to be maintained by the
- 43 SCTF from "risk potential" locations, electronic monitoring of individual residents,
- 44 household security measures and program staffing.

- 1 (b) Nothing herein shall be interpreted as to prohibit or otherwise limit the county

- 13 (94) Farm Product Processing and Farm Support Business: See SCC 30.28.038.
- 14 (95) Farmland Enterprise: See SCC 30.28.037.
- 15 (96) Public Events/Assemblies on Farmland: Such event or assembly shall:
16 (a) Comply with the requirements of SCC 30.53A.800; and
17 (b) Not exceed two events per year. No event shall exceed two weeks in duration.
- 18 (97) Bakery, Farm: The gross floor area of the use shall not exceed 1,000 square feet.
- 19 (98) Recreational Facility Not Otherwise Listed in Ag-10 zone, Forestry (F), or Forestry
20 and Recreation (F&R) zones: See SCC 30.28.076.
- 21 (99) Farm Stand: See SCC 30.28.039.
- 22 (100) Farm Stand: Allowed as a Permitted Use (P) when sited on land designated
23 riverway commercial farmland, upland commercial farmland or local commercial
24 farmland in the comprehensive plan. Allowed as an Administrative Conditional Use (A)
25 when sited on land not designated riverway commercial farmland, upland commercial
26 farmland or local commercial farmland in the comprehensive plan.
- 27 (101) Farmers Market: Allowed as a Permitted Use (P) when sited on land designated
28 riverway commercial farmland, upland commercial farmland or local commercial
29 farmland in the comprehensive plan. Allowed as an Administrative Conditional Use (A)
30 when sited on land not designated riverway commercial farmland, upland commercial
31 farmland or local commercial farmland in the comprehensive plan.
- 32 (102) Community Facilities for Juveniles in R-5 zones must be located within one mile of
33 an active public transportation route at the time of permitting.
- 34 (103) All community facilities for juveniles shall meet the performance standards set
35 forth in SCC 30.28.025.
- 36 (104) Personal Wireless Telecommunications Service Facilities: See chapter 30.28A
37 SCC and landscaping standards in SCC 30.25.025.
- 38 (105) Personal wireless telecommunications service facilities are subject to a building
39 permit pursuant to SCC 30.28A.030 and the development standards set forth in chapter
40 30.28A SCC and landscaping standards in SCC 30.25.025.
- 41 (106) A building permit only is required for facilities co-locating on existing utility poles,
42 towers, and/or antennas unless otherwise specified in chapter 30.28A SCC.
- 43 (107) Agricultural Composting Requirements:
44 (a) On-farm site agricultural composting operations that comply with the
45 requirements established in this section are allowed in the A-10 zone. These
46 composting facilities and operations shall be constructed and operated in

1 compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, rules and

22 The agricultural composting facility shall be constructed and operated in
23 compliance with all applicable federal, state and local laws, statutes, rules and
24 regulations. The Nutrient Management Plan portion of the farm's Snohomish
25 Conservation District Farm Plan or any other established nutrient management
26 plan must be on file with the department when any permit application is submitted
27 to the department for the development of an agricultural composting facility.

28 (108) RESERVED for future use. (Urban Center Demonstration Program projects -
29 DELETED by Ord. 09-079)

30 (109) Privately operated off-road vehicle (ORV) use areas shall be allowed by
31 conditional use permit on Forestry and Recreation (F&R) zoned property designated
32 Forest on the comprehensive plan future land use map. These areas shall be identified
33 by an F&R ORV suffix on the zoning map. Privately operated ORV use areas are
34 regulated pursuant to SCC 30.28.080 and 30.28.086 and other applicable county codes.

35 (110) RESERVED for future use.

36 (111) RESERVED for future use.

37 (112) RESERVED for future use. (Transfer of Development Rights receiving area
38 overlay - DELETED by Amended Ord. 13-064)

39 (113) Privately Operated Motocross Racetracks: Allowed by conditional use permit, and
40 are regulated pursuant to SCC 30.28.100 and 30.28.105, and other applicable county
41 codes. Motocross racetracks are allowed in the Forestry and Recreation (F&R) zone
42 only on commercial forest lands.

43 (114) New AM Radio Towers are prohibited. AM radio towers either constructed before
44 October 13, 2010, or with complete applications for all permits and approvals required
45 for construction before October 13, 2010, shall not be considered nonconforming uses
46 and they may be repaired, replaced, and reconfigured as to the number and dimensions

- 1 of towers so long as the repair, replacement, or reconfiguration occurs on the parcel
2 where the tower was originally constructed or permitted and it does not increase the
3 number of AM radio towers constructed on the parcel.
- 4 (115) This use is prohibited in the R-5 zone with the Mineral Resource Overlay (MRO).
5 Public park is a permitted use on reclaimed portions of mineral excavation sites with the
6 MRO.
- 7 (116) See cottage housing design standard requirements in chapter 30.41G SCC.
- 8 (117) RESERVED for future use.
- 9 (118) RESERVED for future use.
- 10 (119) Only building mounted personal wireless communications facilities shall be
11 permitted.
- 12 (120) Allowed as a conditional use only with a Park-and-Pool Lot or a Park-and-Ride
13 Lot.
- 14 (121) Permitted as an incidental use with a permitted use, conditional use or
15 administrative conditional use.
- 16 (122) Products or merchandise offered for sale or storage by a business may be located
17 outdoors; provided, that:
- 18 (a) The area occupied by the display shall not exceed 500 square feet; and
19 (b) Public sidewalks shall not be enclosed as space for sales or storage by fencing
20 or other means that effectively limits public use of the sidewalk.
- 21 (123) Such uses, except those as provided for in SCC 30.34A.010(4)(d), are permitted
22 only in structures which are legally existing on May 29, 2010. Such uses, except those
23 as provided for in SCC 30.34A.010(4)(d), shall also comply with subsection (122) of this
24 section.

38 land designated Local Forest in the comprehensive plan.
- 39 (128) Development applications for all non-tribally owned, fee-simple properties
40 designated Reservation Commercial on the Snohomish County Future Land Use Map
41 must include an archaeology site report pursuant to SCC 30.32D.200(3)(b) or relocate
42 the project to avoid impacts to any archaeological resources.
- 43 (129) Development within an airport compatibility area is subject to the requirements of
44 chapter 30.32E SCC.

1 (130) On land designated as riverway commercial farmland, upland commercial
2 farmland or local commercial farmland or land zoned A-10 the following additional
3 requirements apply:

4 (a) the applicant must demonstrate that the use is incidental to the primary use of
5 the site for agricultural purposes and supports, promotes or sustains agricultural
6 operations and production;

7 (b) the use must be located, designed, and operated so as to not interfere with,
8 and to support the continuation of, the overall agricultural use of the property and
9 neighboring properties;

10 (c) the use and all activities and structures related to the use must be consistent
11 with the size, scale, and intensity of the existing agricultural use of the property
12 and the existing buildings on the site;

13 (d) the use and all activities and structures related to the use must be located
14 within the general area of the property that is already developed for buildings and

16 (e) where the property is less than 10 acres in size, the use and all structures and
17 activities related to the use shall not convert more than 10 percent of agricultural

21 land to nonagricultural uses; and

22 (g) any land disturbing activity required to support the use shall be limited to
23 preserve prime farmland.

39 shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or
40 phrase of this ordinance. Provided, however, that if any section, sentence, clause or
41 phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid by the Board or court of competent
42 jurisdiction, then the section, sentence, clause or phrase in effect prior to the effective
43 date of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect for that individual section,
