

5 6 7 8	ADOPTING CHANGES IN VOTING PRECINCTS PURSUANT TO RCW 29A.16.040, RCW 29A.16.050 AND CHAPTER 2.47 SCC; AMENDING CHAPTER 2.47 SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE

10	WHEREAS, SCC 2.47.040(2) provides that the County Auditor may temporarily
11 12	adjust precinct boundaries to maintain conformance with applicable state laws, and that
12	such revisions to voting precincts must be submitted to the County Council for adoption
13 14	by ordinance no later than May 1 of each year; and
14 15	WHEREAS, Exhibit A attached hereto sets forth the precinct changes made by the
16	Auditor since March 17, 2016, including those temporarily adjusted to maintain
17	conformance with applicable state law, resulting in a total of 775 voting precincts in
18	Snohomish County as of February 27, 2017. Exhibit A details 9 changes to precincts due
19	to city annexations and 15 administrative changes to precincts due to growth in the
20	number of voters in a precinct;

22	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

24	Section 1. The Council finds that pursuant to the authority of SCC 2.47.040(2), the
25	Auditor made those adjustments to precinct boundaries since March 17, 2016, that are set
26	forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

28	Section 2. Snohomish County Code Section 2.47.030, last amended by Ordinance 16-012
29 30	on March 2, 2016, is amended to read:

33	(1) The adopted voting precinct boundaries for the county are those set forth in
34	the precinct map books maintained on file with the clerk of the council and the
35	Snohomish county auditor's office, subject to revision from time to time in accordance
36	with SCC 2.47.040.

38	(2) To implement boundary changes resulting from redistricting following the
39	federal decennial census and to implement changes that are necessary to maintain
40	conformance with applicable laws in accordance with SCC 2.47.040, the precinct
41	boundaries adopted by subsection (1) are revised cumulatively as set forth in the

#### **CRITERIA FOR ADJUSTING PRECINCT BOUNDARIES**

To identify issues pertaining to precinct boundaries and the functional areas which might be impacted by the population, portions, descriptions and number of voting precincts, various factors have been reviewed. These include:

1. Boundary limitations

Legal requirements mandated by various RCW's require that precinct boundaries do not cross congressional, legislative, judicial, county council or municipal boundaries. These limitations might 'force' the creation of some precincts well below the target size.

2. Number of registered voters

The total number of registered voters per precinct shall not exceed the limit of 1,000 as set by the Snohomish County Council in SCC 2.47.

3. Precincts with school district splits

Since school districts are one of the most active districts having elections within the county, precincts with multiple school districts will be kept to an absolute minimum.

4. Growth potential of area

Growth potential is based on factors such as areas being within Urban Growth Areas and land parcel availability. Growth potential will be a factor in determining how close to the target size each precinct should be.

5. Precincts with multiple district splits

Areas with a large number of portions will be reviewed as to the possibility of reducing district splits within precinct boundaries.

6. Discontinuous precinct portions

Due to city annexations, various precincts have developed parts that are no longer contiguous with the main area of that precinct. These "islands" will be studied for possible merger into adjacent precincts.

7. Use of Census Boundary Standards

In all cases of boundary changes, Census Boundary Standards will be used where possible to designate new precinct lines.





### **CEDARHOME** annexation into STANWOOD 5




## **NRV TANK FARM annexation into WOODWAY 1**




### **FLORENCE & STANBY annexation into STANWOOD 1**




## **SPENCER** annexation into EVERETT 5




# SO. ALDERWOOD to SAMOEA to reduce voter count




### **REDHAWK to GRANNIS to reduce voter count**






