The proposal implements the State Building Code and further streamlines and provides greater internal consistency of the SCC.  Building Code will not result in less restrictive performance standards or objectives than those
 in the State Building Code.
- E. The County Council concludes that this ordinance does not adopt development regulations
 under SCC 30.10.080. Therefore, Planning Commission review is not required pursuant to
 SCC 30.73.040(2)(c).
- F. The County Council concludes that this ordinance does not adopt development regulations
