AMENDED ORDINANCE NO. 18-024

ADOPTING CHANGES IN VOTING PRECINCTS PURSUANT TO
RCW 29A.16.040, RCW 29A.16.050 AND CHAPTER 2.47 SCC; AMENDING
CHAPTER 2.47 SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE

WHEREAS, SCC 2.47.040(2) provides that the County Auditor may temporarily adjust precinct boundaries to maintain conformance with applicable state laws, and that such revisions to voting precincts must be submitted to the County Council for adoption by ordinance no later than May 1 of each year; and

WHEREAS, Exhibit A attached hereto sets forth the precinct changes made by the Auditor since April 5, 2017, including those temporarily adjusted to maintain conformance with applicable state law, resulting in a total of 777 voting precincts in Snohomish County as of February 5, 2018. Exhibit A details 8 changes to precincts due to city annexations and 13 administrative changes to precincts due to growth in the number of voters in a precinct;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. The Council finds that pursuant to the authority of SCC 2.47.040(2), the Auditor made those adjustments to precinct boundaries since April 5, 2017, that are set forth in Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference.

Section 2. Snohomish County Code Section 2.47.030, last amended by Ordinance 17-012 on April 5, 2017, is amended to read:

2.47.030 Precincts adopted.

(1) The adopted voting precinct boundaries for the county are those set forth in the precinct map books maintained on file with the clerk of the council and the Snohomish county auditor's office, subject to revision from time to time in accordance with SCC 2.47.040.

(2) To implement boundary changes resulting from redistricting following the federal decennial census and to implement changes that are necessary to maintain conformance with applicable laws in accordance with SCC 2.47.040, the precinct boundaries adopted by subsection (1) are revised cumulatively as set forth in the following documents:

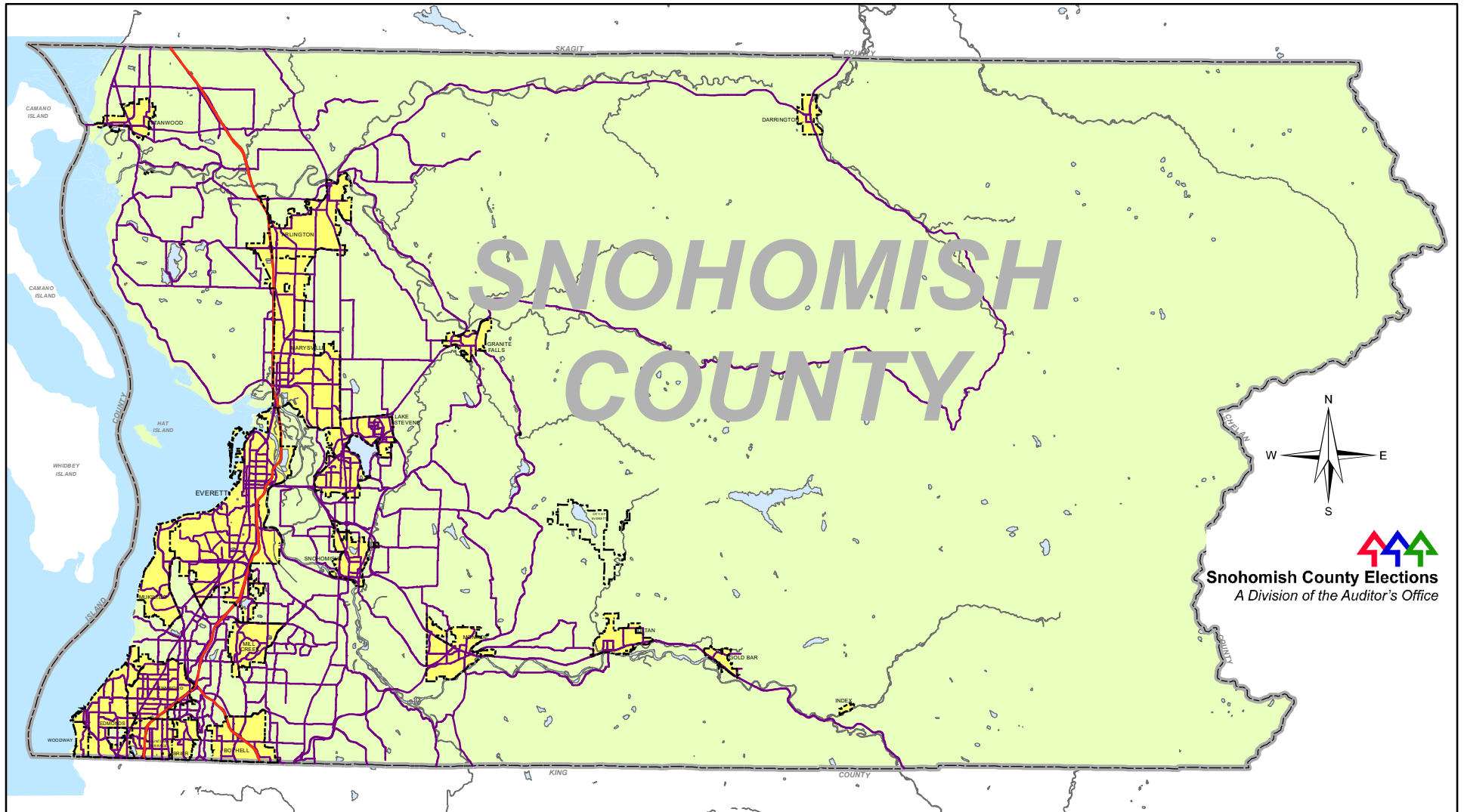

CRITERIA FOR ADJUSTING PRECINCT BOUNDARIES

To identify issues pertaining to precinct boundaries and the functional areas which might be impacted by the population, portions, descriptions and number of voting precincts, various factors have been reviewed. These include:

1. Boundary limitations
Legal requirements mandated by various RCW's require that precinct boundaries do not cross congressional, legislative, judicial, county council or municipal boundaries. These limitations might 'force' the creation of some precincts well below the target size.
2. Number of registered voters
The total number of registered voters per precinct shall not exceed the limit of 1,000 as set by the Snohomish County Council in SCC 2.47.
3. Precincts with school district splits
Since school districts are one of the most active districts having elections within the county, precincts with multiple school districts will be kept to an absolute minimum.
4. Growth potential of area
Growth potential is based on factors such as areas being within Urban Growth Areas and land parcel availability. Growth potential will be a factor in determining how close to the target size each precinct should be.
5. Precincts with multiple district splits
Areas with a large number of portions will be reviewed as to the possibility of reducing district splits within precinct boundaries.
6. Discontinuous precinct portions
Due to city annexations, various precincts have developed parts that are no longer contiguous with the main area of that precinct. These "islands" will be studied for possible merger into adjacent precincts.
7. Use of Census Boundary Standards
In all cases of boundary changes, Census Boundary Standards will be used where possible to designate new precinct lines.

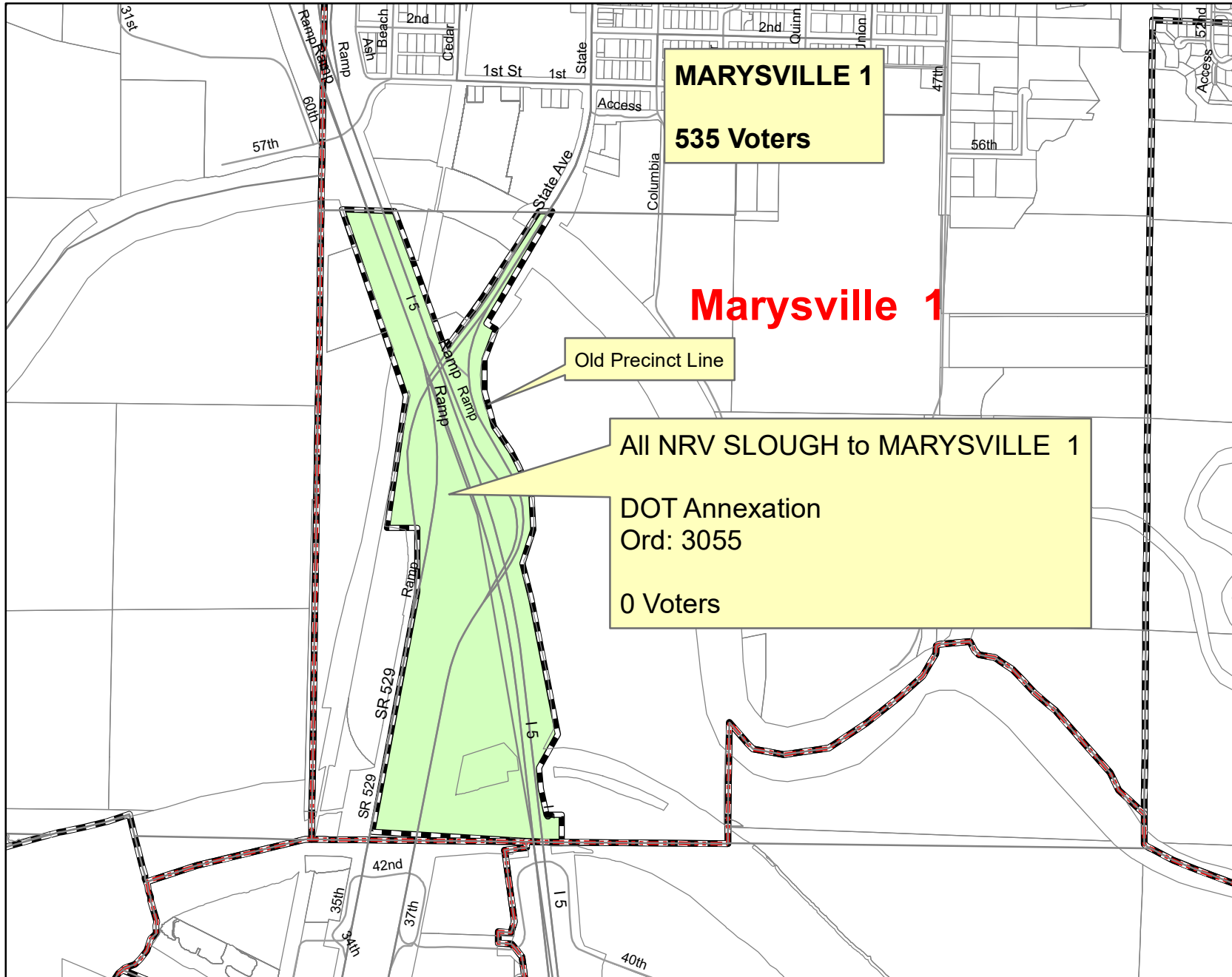

(County Council District 1)



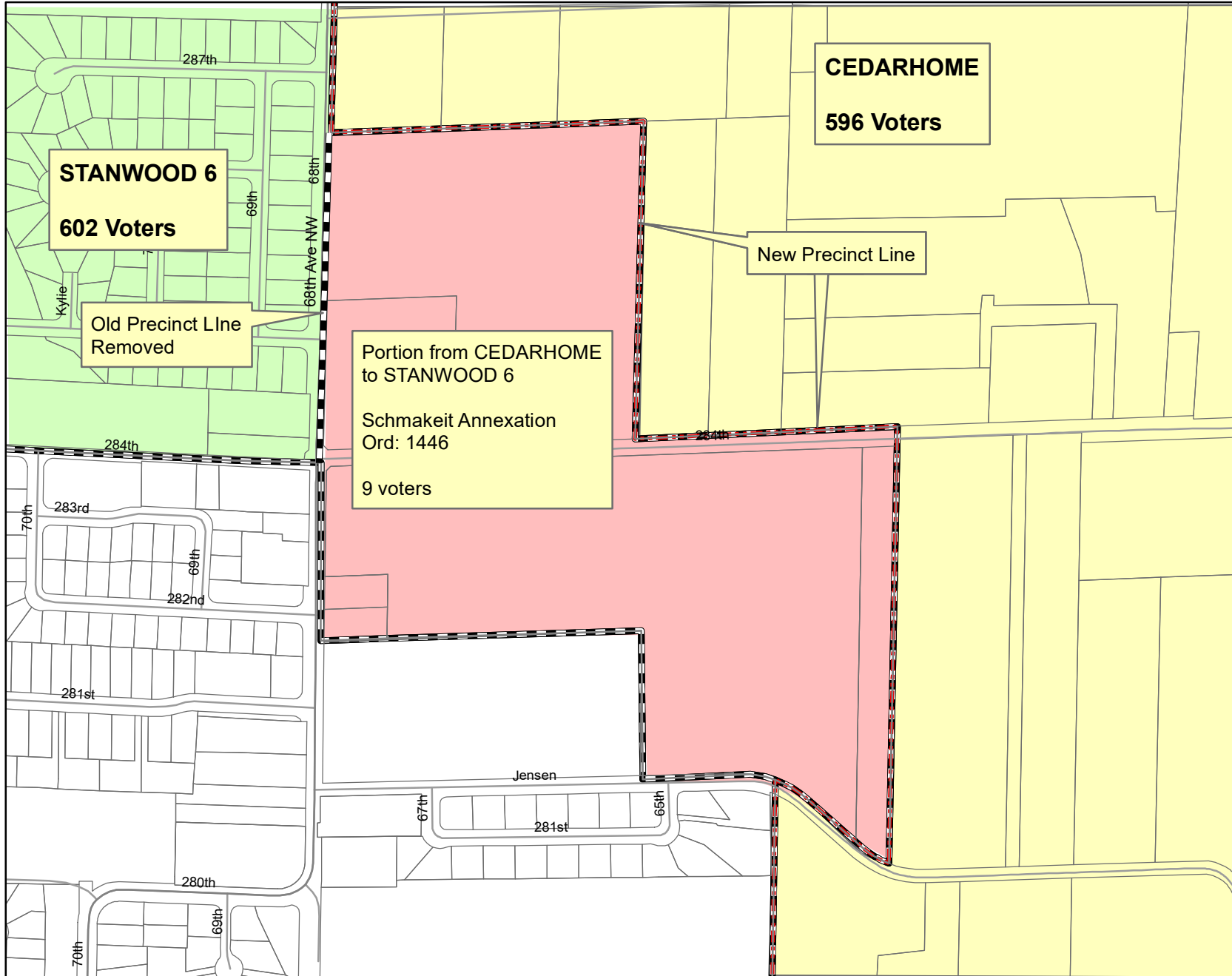

(County Council District 1)



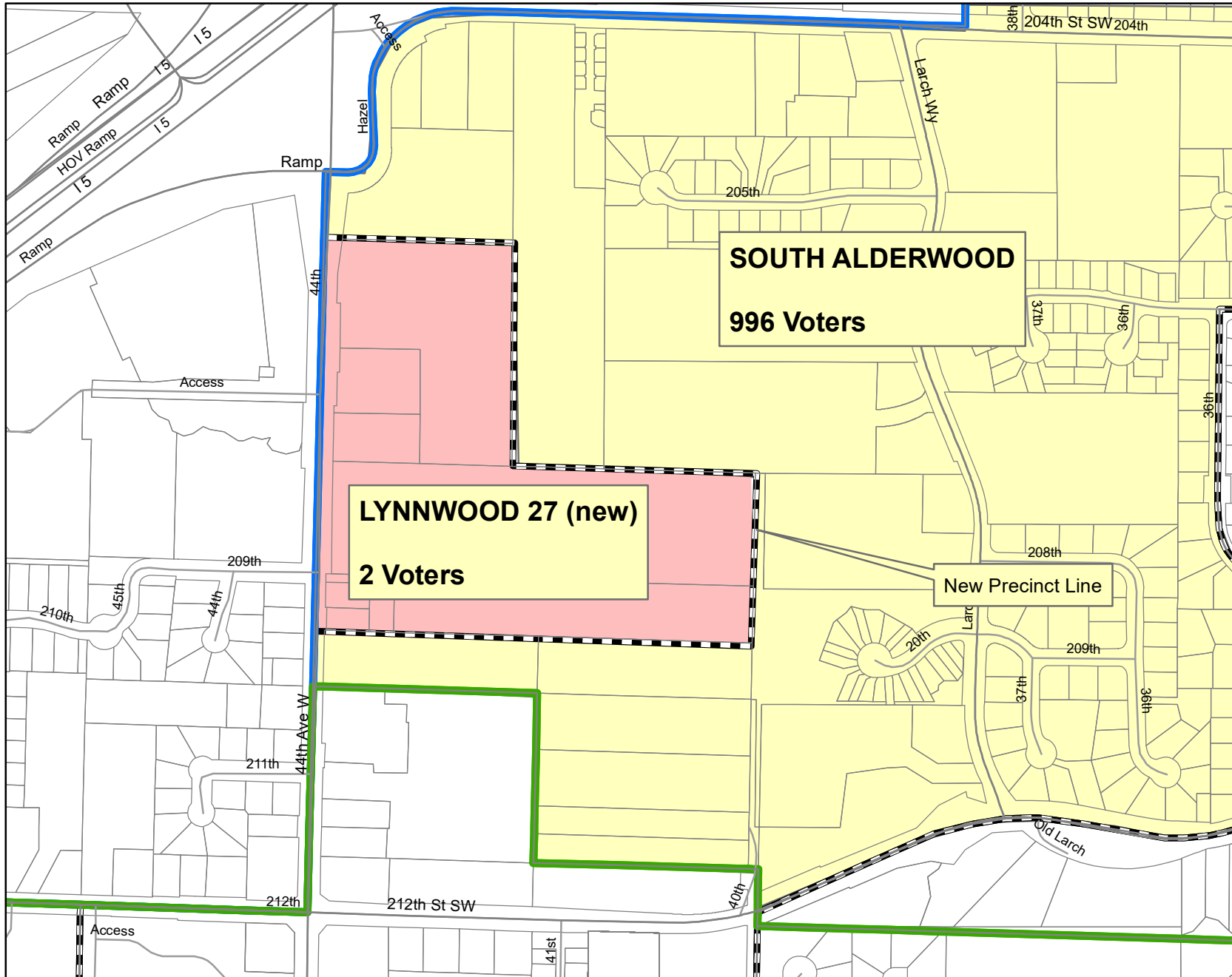

SO ALDERWOOD annexation to (new) LYNNWOOD 27

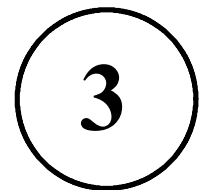

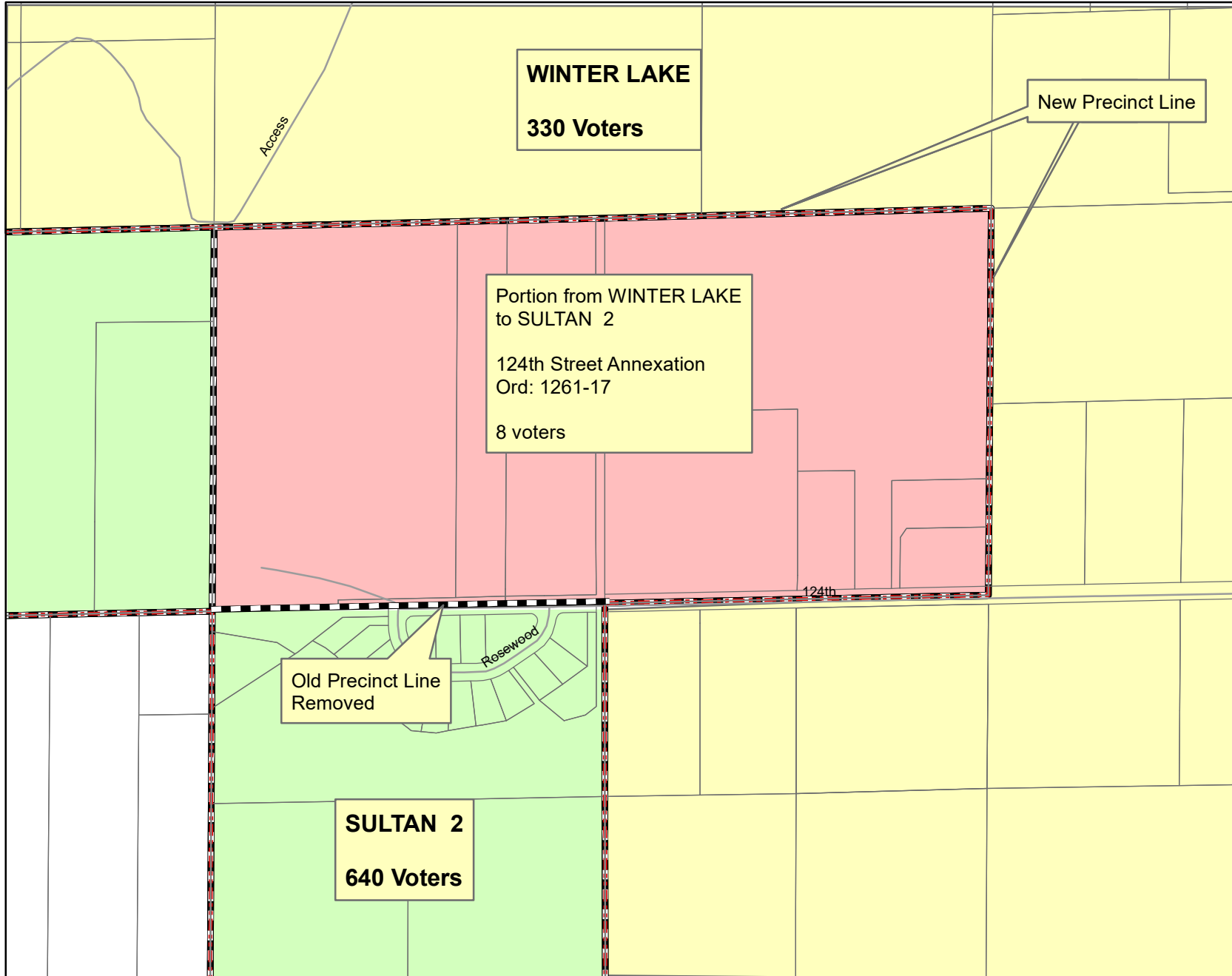

(County Council District 5)



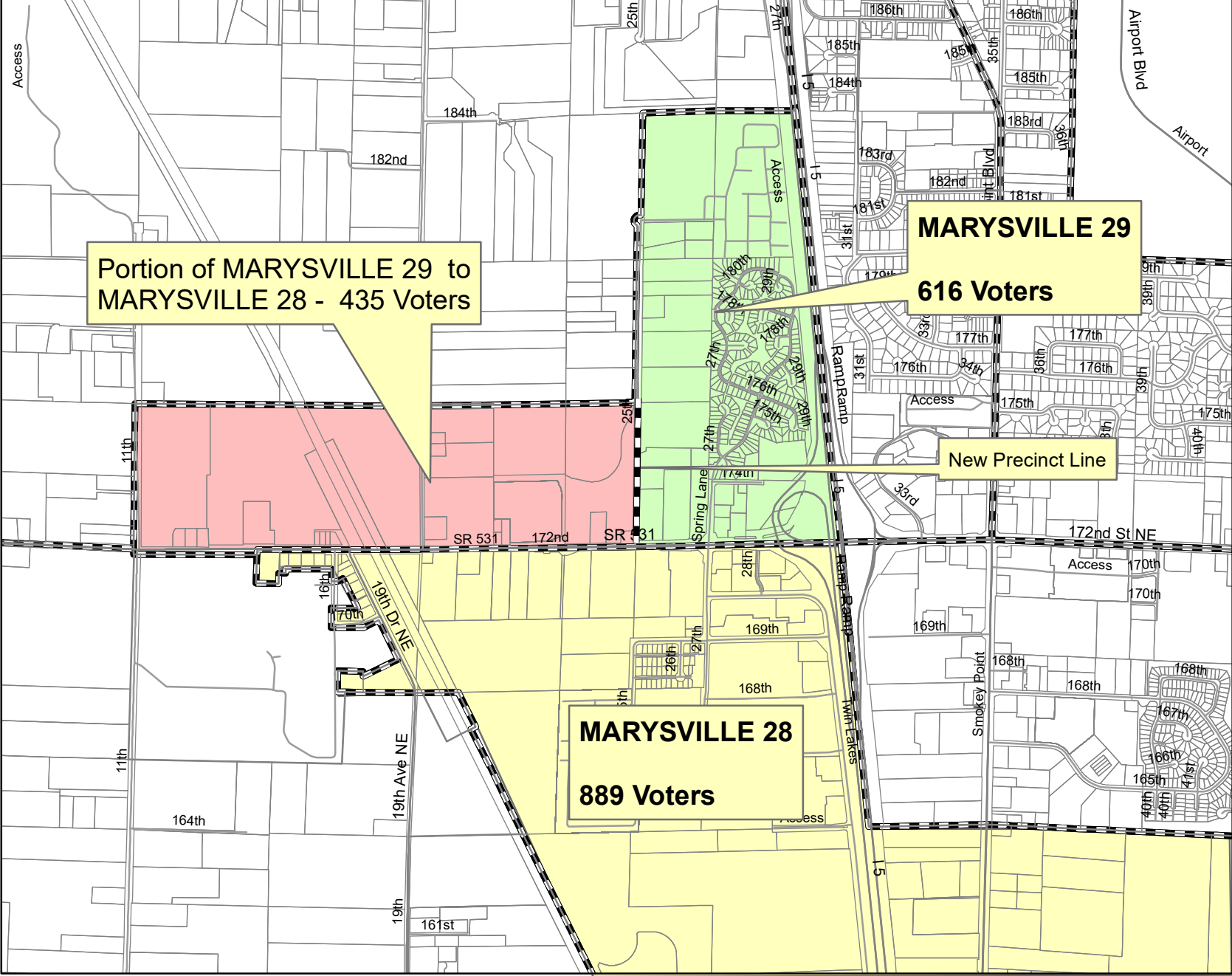

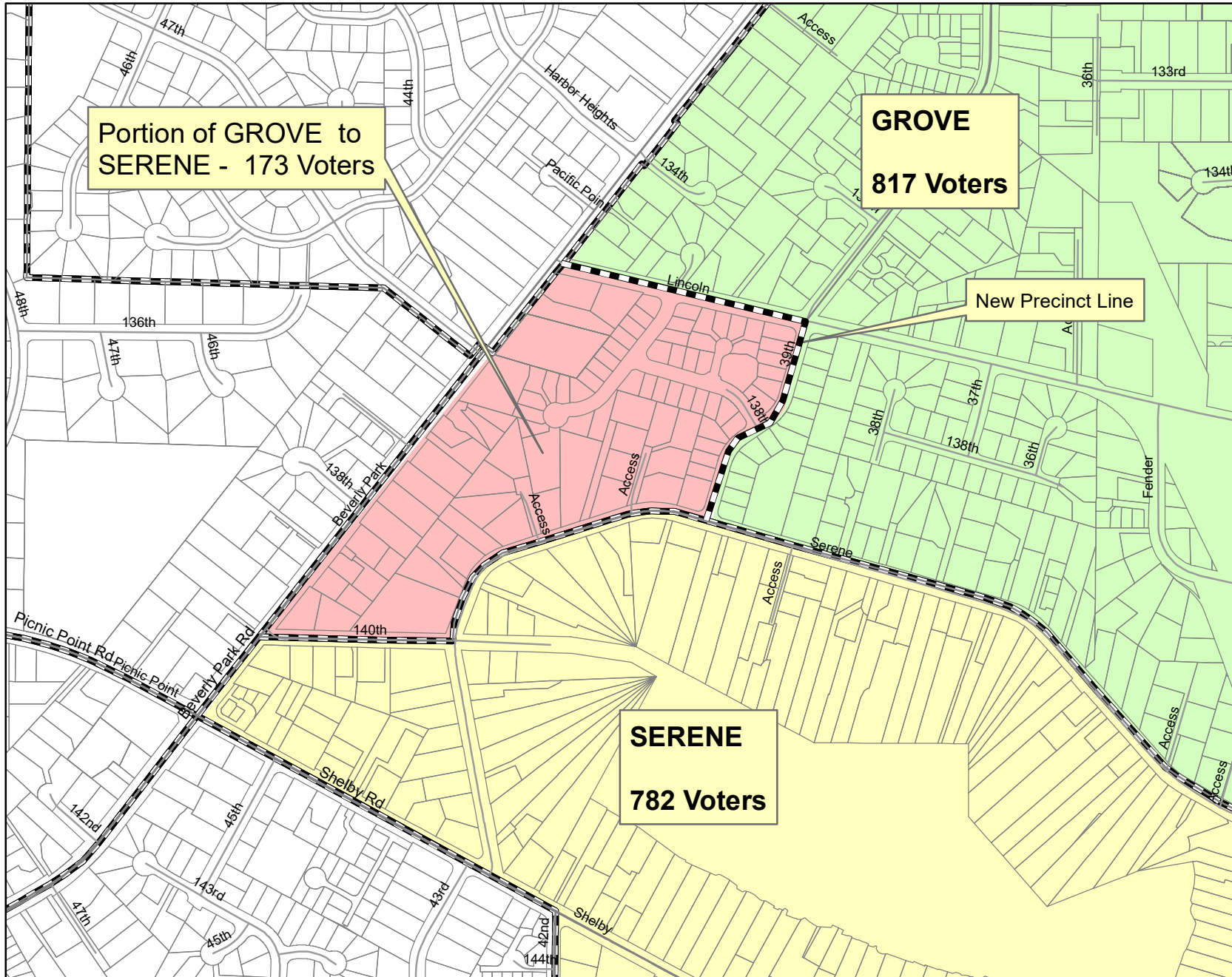

GROVE to SERENE to reduce voter count

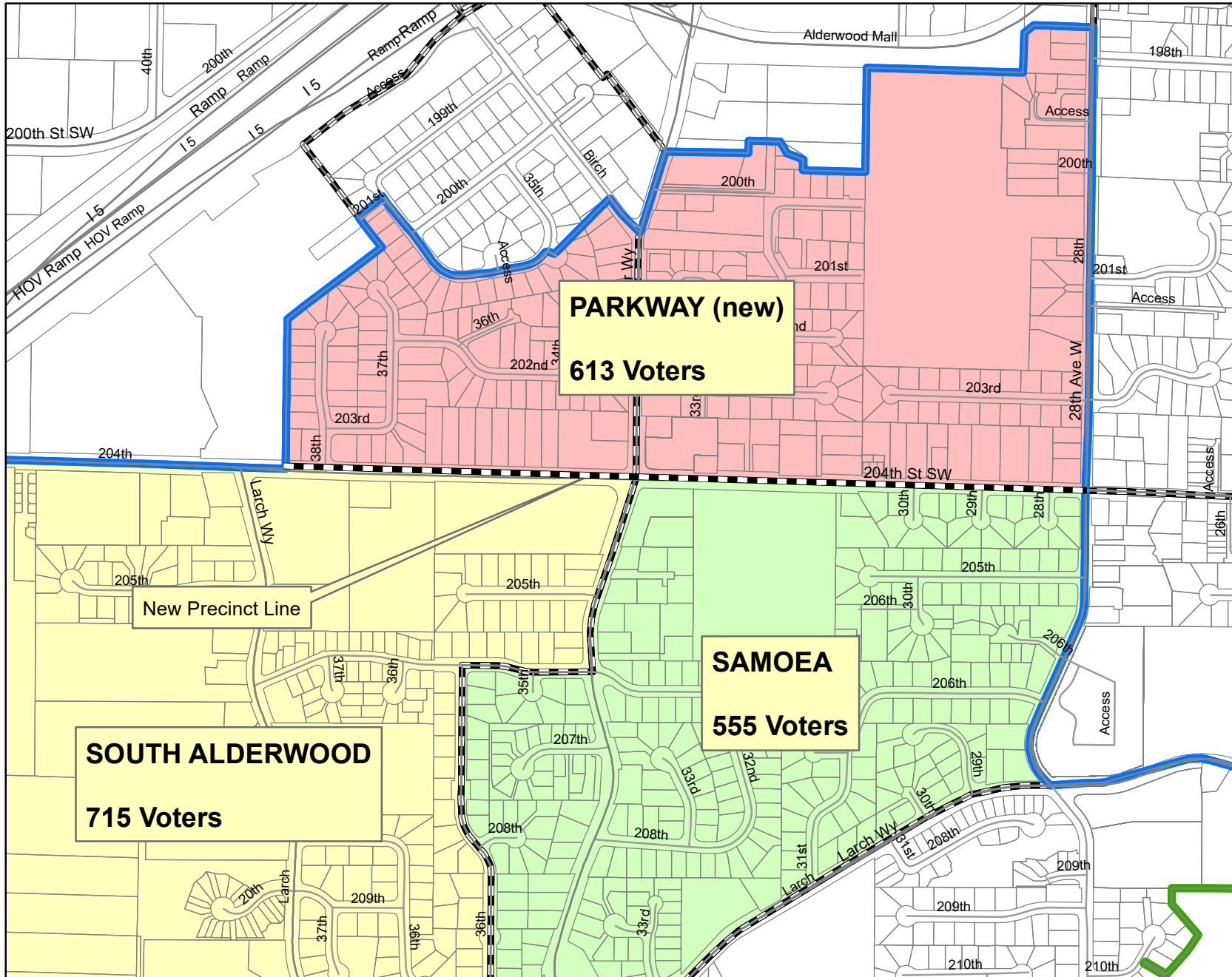

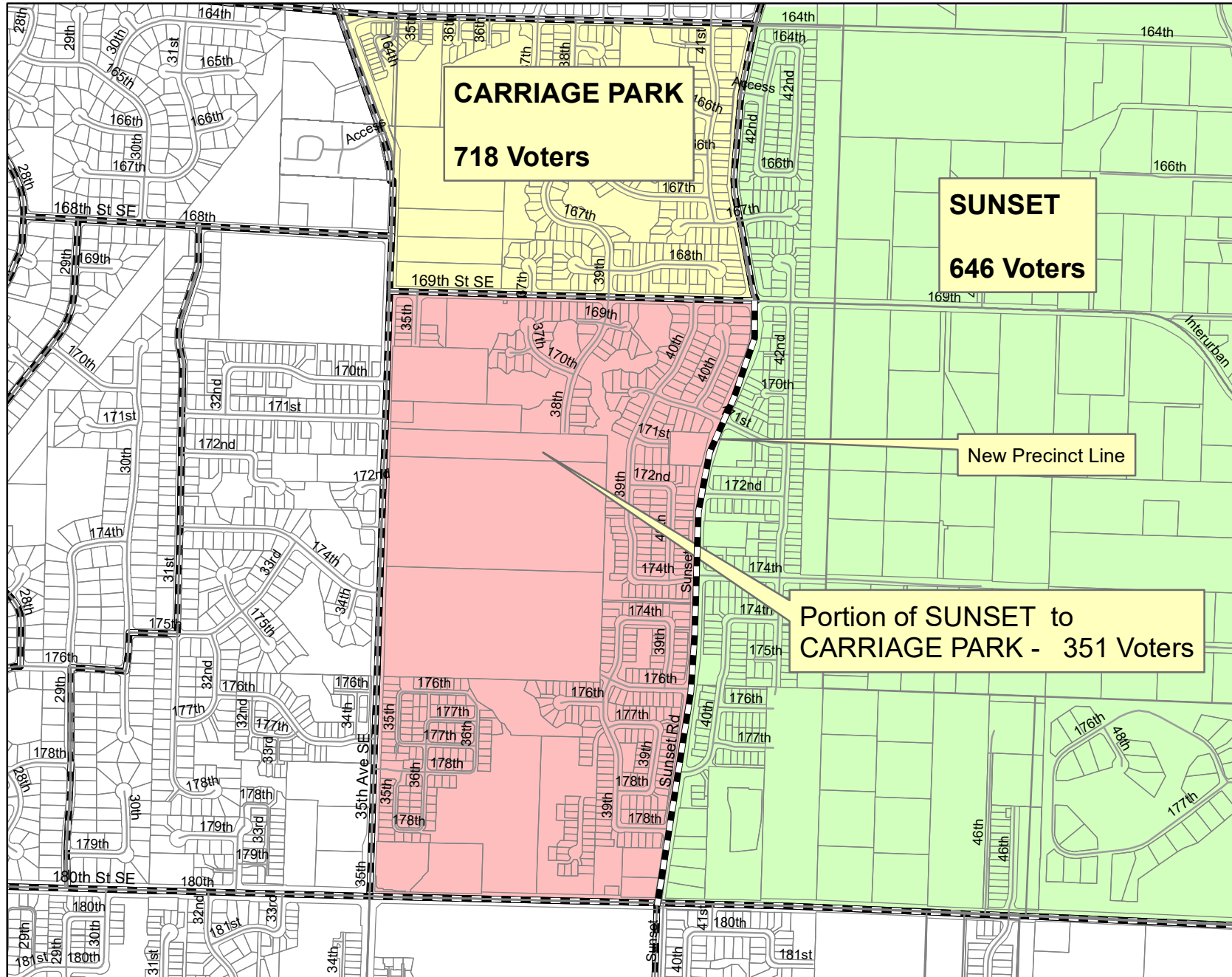

(County Council District 4)

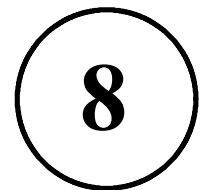

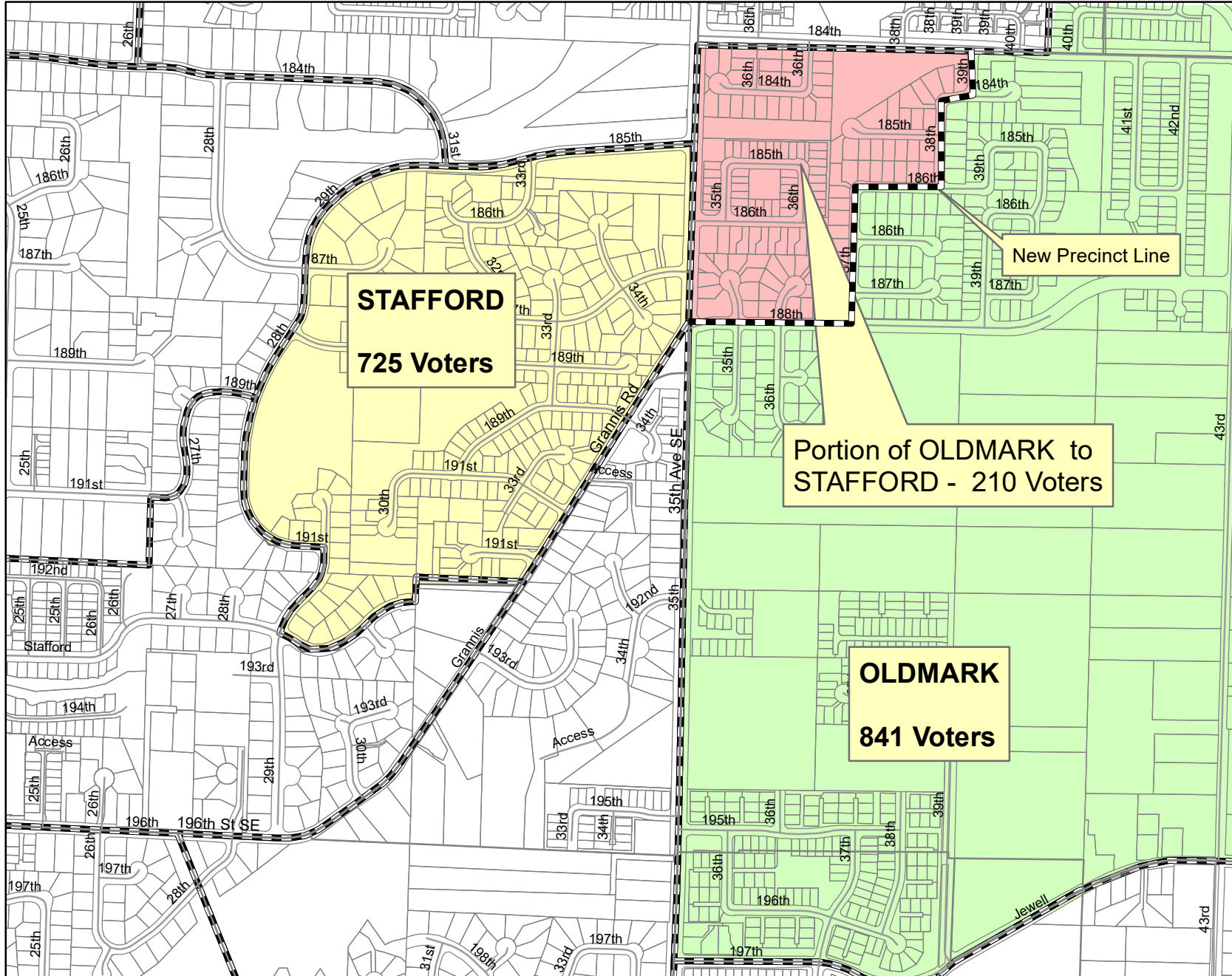

(County Council District 4)

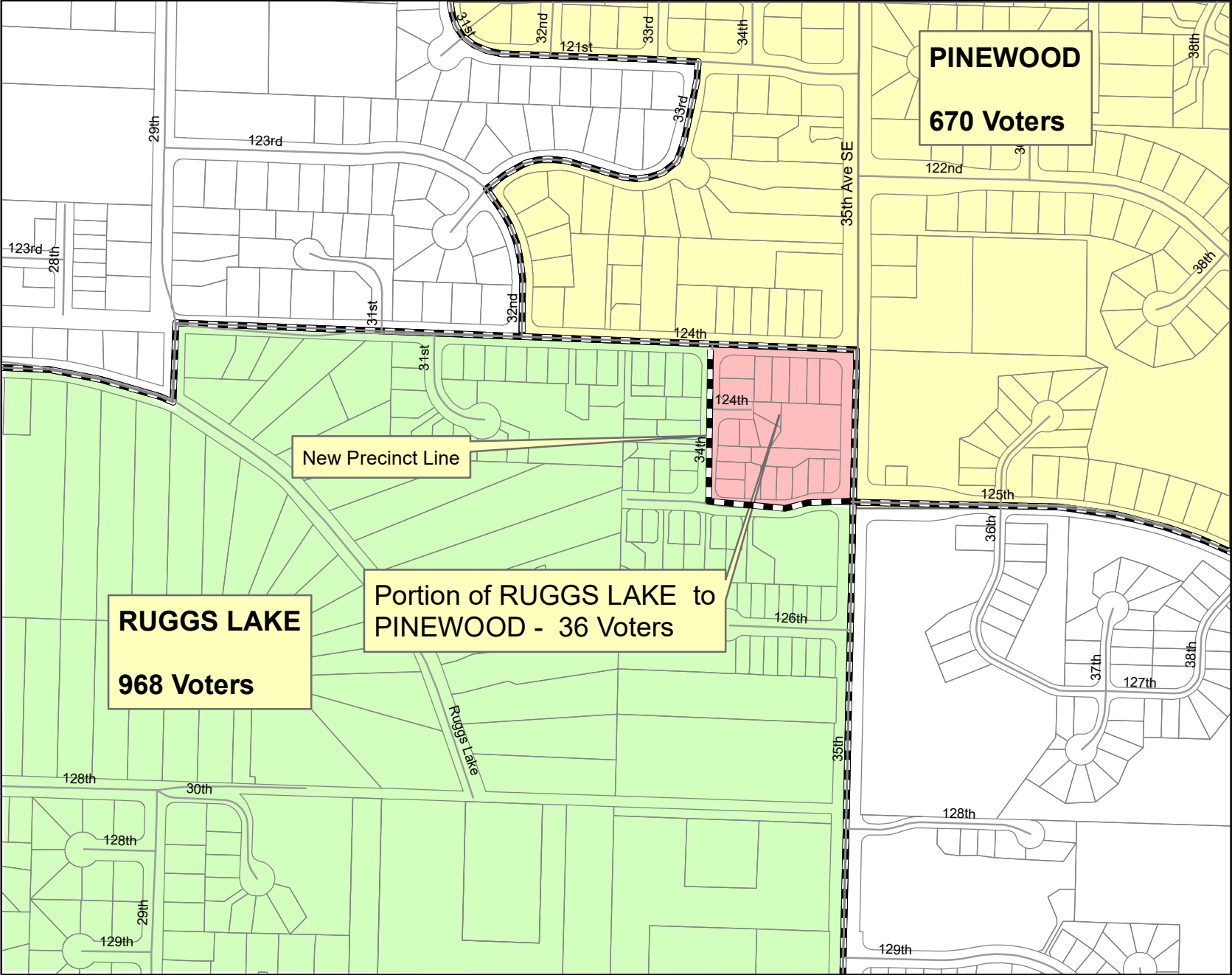
