ORDINANCE No. 82-042

RELATING TO JUSTICE COURTS, AMENDING CHAPTER 2.12 OF  
SNOHOMISH COUNTY CODE, REPEALING SECTIONS,  
CREATING NEW SECTIONS

BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. That the following new sections are added to  
Chapter 2.12 of the Snohomish County Code:

2.12.011 Reduction of Everett District Judge Positions:  
Repeal

(1) The number of judges to be elected in the  
Everett District shall be reduced to two effective  
January 10, 1983.

(2) This section is hereby repealed on January  
12, 1987.

2.12.012 District Judge Position Added, South District:  
Repeal

(1) There is hereby added one full time justice  
position to the South District in addition to the  
number of positions authorized for said district  
prior to the passage of this 1982 ordinance. The  
term of office of this additional justice position  
shall commence January 10, 1983.

(2) This section is hereby repealed on January  
12, 1987.

2.12.013 Election of Additional District Judge: Repeal

(1) The County Auditor shall accept declarations  
of candidacy for the office created by section  
2.12.012 during the filing period provided by law  
prior to the primary election, to be held on  
September 14, 1982, and the general election to be  
held on the first Tuesday of November, 1982. The  
County Auditor shall not accept declarations for  
candidacy nor provide ballot positions for more  
than two justice positions for the Everett  
District in the primary election, to be held on  
September 14, 1982, and the general election to be  
held on the first Tuesday of November, 1982.

(2) The office created by section 2.12.012 shall  
become effective January 10, 1983. Such office  
shall be filled by the person elected and  
qualified at the general election immediately  
preceding such effective date.

(3) This section is hereby repealed on January  
12, 1987.

2.12.015 Dissolution of Districts; Termination of District Justice Positions

(1) The Cascade, Evergreen, Everett and South Justice Court Districts shall be dissolved on January 12, 1987.

(2) All District Court Justice positions for Cascade, Evergreen, Everett and South Justice Court Districts are terminated on January 12, 1987.

2.12.016 Creation of District

On and after January 12, 1987, there shall be established a single, county-wide Justice Court District to be known as the Snohomish County Justice Court District.

2.12.017 Election of District Judges

(1) The County Auditor shall accept declarations of candidacy for the offices created by section 2.12.071 during the filing period provided by law prior to the general election to be held on the first Tuesday of November, 1986.

(2) The offices created by section 2.12.071 shall become effective January 12, 1987. Such offices shall be filled by persons elected and qualified at the general election immediately preceding such effective date.

(3) District Court judges shall be elected by judicial electoral districts within the county-wide justice court district if, at the time of the 1986 election, such electoral districts are authorized by state law. If such electoral districts are not authorized by state law, the district court judges shall be elected county-wide.

2.12.018 Consolidation Planning and Implementation Advisory Committee

(1) It is the intent of the county council that the justice court be operated as a county-wide system to most effectively and efficiently accommodate court workload and serve the citizens of Snohomish County. In the best interest of justice and service to the community, the justice court shall be so structured to insure that a county-wide venue be maintained.

(2) A consolidation planning and implementation advisory committee, hereafter referred to as the advisory committee, is hereby established to develop and implement a detailed plan for restructuring the County's justice courts consistent with the County Council's intent expressed in this ordinance.

(3) Membership terms and compensation

The committee shall be comprised of nine (9) members. These members shall be:

- one (1) citizen at large

- one (1) district court judge
- one (1) superior court judge
- one (1) representative of the practicing bar
- one (1) district court administrator
- The Director of the department of assigned counsel
- one (1) representative of the local state patrol district
- the prosecuting attorney or his designee
- one (1) representative of the cities and towns of Snohomish County.

The advisory committee members shall be appointed by the County council and will serve at their pleasure.

Vacancies on the committee shall be filled in the same manner as the initial appointment by the Council.

Members of the advisory committee shall serve for the term of the project and shall receive no compensation. The committee shall be dissolved by March 31, 1987, unless its term is extended by act of the County Council.

(4) Chairperson

The committee will elect one of its members to serve as chairperson. The chairperson's responsibilities will include conducting meetings and reporting committee progress to the Council.

(5) Meetings

The advisory committee shall conduct one regularly scheduled meeting per month for the term of the project. Other meetings may be scheduled as deemed necessary by the chairperson.

(6) Mission

The advisory committee shall develop a plan for enabling the effective transition of the four district courts into a one district, county-wide, justice court system.

(7) Staff

The County council shall make available to the committee a part-time paid staff person.

The compensation and qualifications of this person shall be established by the council.

Staff duties shall include, but will not be limited to, performing research and analysis, and preparation of written materials.

Section 2. That sections 2.12.060 and 2.12.065 of the Snohomish County Code, enacted April 19, 1974, are repealed.

Section 3. That the following sections of Chapter 2.12 of the Snohomish County Code are repealed:

2.12.080 Location of Central Offices, Courtrooms, and Records; Repeal.

South District	South Snohomish County Judicial Building, Lynnwood

(2) This section is hereby repealed on January 12, 1987.



2.12.110 Departments; Repeal

(1) The Everett District shall be divided into Departments No. 1 and No. 2. The South District shall be divided into Departments No. 1, No. 2, and No. 3.

(2) This section is hereby repealed on January 12, 1987.

Section 5. The following new section is added to Chapter 2.12 of the Snohomish County Code.

2.12.021 District Boundaries

The County justice court district shall include all land lying within the boundaries of Snohomish County including all land within and outside of incorporated cities and towns.

2.12.071 Number of Judges

There shall be seven judges elected in the County justice court district. The terms of office of said judges shall commence January 12, 1987.

2.12.081 Location of Central Offices, Courtrooms and Records

The central offices, courtrooms and records of the district shall be located at the County Courthouse, Everett, Washington. Additional offices, courtrooms and records shall be located at the County court facility, Arlington, Washington; the County court facility, Monroe, Washington and the South Snohomish County Judicial Building, Lynnwood, Washington.

2.12.111 Departments

The district shall be divided into seven departments.

Section 6. That Section 2.12.140 of the Snohomish County Code, last amended on April 29, 1974, is repealed and the following new section is added.

2.12.140 Effective Dates of Amendments

The effective date of sections 2, 3, and 4 of this Ordinance 82 - 042 dated June \_\_\_\_\_, 1982 shall be January 10, 1983. The effective date of section 5 of this ordinance shall be January 12, 1987.
