ORDINANCE NO. 82-114
AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING LEASH LAW ZONES FOR
PORTIONS OF UNINCORPORATED SNOHOMISH COUNTY

BE IT ORDAINED:

Section 1. That section 9.14.010, Section 22 of
Resolution adopted July 10, 1978, is amended to read as
follows:

9.14.010 Purposes. Under the authority of RCW Chapter
16.10 and the general police power of the county's
legislative body, (~~it~~) this chapter is intended to further
protect the public health, safety and welfare in regard to
the control of dogs. To this end, the purpose of the
resolution codified herein is to establish: a means by
which any county residents so desiring may petition for a
dog leash law for their areas; and a means by which the
legislative body of the county may determine the need for
said law in said area; and a means by which said law, if
enacted, may be administered and enforced. (ss22 (part) of
Res. adopted June 10, 1978).

Section 2. That Section 9.14.040(1), Section 22 of
Resolution adopted July 10, 1978, is amended to read as
follows:

9.14.040 Exceptions. The prohibition contained in
Section 9.14.030 shall not apply to dogs that are under
control while engaged in one of the following:

(1) Being within sight and within ten (10) feet or
voice control of an owner of ten (10) years of age or older;
provided that said dog shall not be trespassing on private
property.

Section 3. That section 9.14.050, Section 22 of Resolution adopted July 10, 1978, is amended to read as follows:

9.14.050 Standards for leash law zone applications.
The following minimum standards shall be met by any application for a leash law zone in Snohomish County;

(1) The proposed zone shall contain a minimum of fifty (50) single family dwellings, or, in the alternative, it shall contain a minimum area of one (1) square miles;

(2) The proposed zone shall have readily identifiable boundaries. If reasonably possible, said boundaries shall constitute a physical barrier, i.e., a river, freeway, etc.;

(3) The petition for the proposed zone shall contain a minimum of fifty-one percent (51%) of the zone's registered voters signing in its favor;

(4) The completed petition supporting the proposed zone shall be presented to the county ((~~commissioners~~)) council. (ss22 (part) of Res. adopted July 10, 1978).

Section 4. That section 9.14.060, section 22 of Resolution adopted July 10, 1978 is amended to read as follows:

9.14.060 Petition form. Petitions for leash law zones shall be substantially in the following form:

"WARNING

"Every person who signs this petition with any other than his true name, or who knowingly signs more than one of these petitions, or who signs this petition when he is not a legal registered voter, or who makes herein any false statement, may be punished by fine or imprisonment or both.

PETITION FOR LEASH LAW ZONE

To the ((~~Board-of~~)) County Council ((~~Commissioners~~)),
Snohomish County:

We, the undersigned citizens of the State of Washington and legally registered voters of the respective precincts set opposite our name, respectfully request that the area known as _____, be established as a leash law zone.

Failure to comply with any of the above format will not invalidate the petition, but rather shall be a matter for consideration by the ((~~board~~)) council as to whether the minimum standards of Section 9.14.050 have been met. (ss22 (part) of Res. adopted July 10, 1978).

Section 5. That section 9.14.070, section 22 of Resolution adopted July 10, 1978 is amended to read as follows:

9.14.070 Public Hearing. Upon receipt of a leash law zone application and petition, as set forth in Sections 9.14.050 through 9.14.060, the county ((~~board-of-county-commissioners~~)) council shall set the matter for consideration upon a public hearing as set forth in RCW 16.10.020 through 16.10.030. (ss22 (part) of Res. adopted July 10, 1978).

Section 6. That section 9.14.111, Ordinance 80-095, Sec. 1, adopted November 24, 1980; Ordinance 80-062, Sec. 1, adopted October 6, 1980; 80-019, Sections 1 and 2, adopted July 7, 1980; Resolution 79-372, adopted December 10, 1979; Resolution 79-341, adopted November 13, 1979; Resolution 79-310, adopted October 8, 1979; Resolution 79-270, adopted September 10, 1979; and Resolution 79-24, adopted March 12, 1979, is repealed.

Section 7. A new section 9.14.111 is added to the Snohomish County Code as follows:

9.14.111 Dog leash law zones. The following are established as dog leash law zones:

(1) In the unincorporated areas of Snohomish County.

Boundaries:

(A) On the north, the centerline of 172nd Street N.E. between Interstate 5 and Highway 9;

(B) On the east, the centerline of Highway 9 between 172nd Street N.E. and the King County boundary;

(C) On the south, the King County boundary between Puget Sound and Highway 9;

(D) On the west, the centerline of Interstate 5 between 172nd Street and Hewitt Avenue; Puget Sound between Hewitt Avenue and the King County boundary.

(2) Marysville West and Tierra Bonita.

Boundaries:

(A) On the north, the centerline of 72nd Drive N.E. between 19th Avenue N.E. and 23rd Drive N.E.;

(B) On the east, the centerline of 23rd Drive N.E. between 72nd Street N.E. and Tulalip Highway (Marine Drive);

(C) On the south, the centerline of Tulalip Drive (Marine Drive) between 19th Avenue N.E. and 23rd Drive N.E.;

(D) On the west, the centerline of 9th Avenue N.E. between Tulalip Drive (Marine Drive) and 72nd Street N.E.
